A Vibrant Church Moving Forward

FROM JASON LYON, SENIOR WARDEN

What an exciting time to be a member of All Saints Church!

As we bid a fond and bittersweet farewell to our beloved Rector of 21 years, Ed Bacon, the Rector Search Committee continues its prayerful discernment with the final candidates for the call to be our next Rector. In the meantime, life in our vibrant parish continues apace.

In preparing to welcome our new Rector, the All Saints Vestry and its ministries have been taking stock of our work, making sure that our mission of 'making God's love tangible 24/7' is being effectively communicated and that our work is best directed to bring that mission to life. At its April meeting, the Vestry adopted a resolution on Racial Justice. The resolution, authored by All Saints' COLORS ministry and sponsored by the Peace and Justice Committee, renews our pledge to practice radical inclusivity of all racial, ethnic, and cultural groups and affirms our commitment to interrupt racism in all its manifestations. Perhaps most significantly, the Racial Justice Resolution sets forth ten concrete actions we commit to undertake as a community. Among those is the establishment and maintenance of a Racial Justice Advisory Board to guide and monitor our work to make manifest the values underlying the resolution.

At its May and June meetings, the Vestry also will consider a resolution on climate change that calls on us all – as a parish and as individuals – to become carbon-neutral and move to sustainable practices as soon as possible. If adopted, that resolution will join the Racial Justice Resolution and last year's Economic Justice Resolution to guide and frame our missional work for the next season of our communal life.

Meanwhile, the parish is in good hands. Among the many things I love about the Episcopal Church is that we do governance well. The Church canons and parish bylaws are structured in such a way that no parish ever goes without leadership, and All Saints is no exception. The 24-member Vestry remains our lay leadership, overseeing our work to make All Saints a bright, bold beacon of God's inexhaustible love. Aided by our Director of Giving, Jim Loduha, and Parish Administrator, Christina Honchell, the Vestry also provides thoughtful stewardship of our resources. As Senior Warden, I will assume the role of Chair of the Vestry until our next Rector is called, and Junior Warden Rick Davis will join me in presiding over our regular meetings.

Our Senior Associate for Pastoral Care, Zelda Kennedy, will serve as our Priest in Charge, leading the clergy and staff in the day to day operations of the church. She will be joined in the pulpit by our amazingly deep bench of gifted preachers: Susan Russell, Jon Dephouse, Sally Howard and our dear friend Gary Hall, who is now back in Pasadena. Antonio Gallardo remains our Pastor for Latino Ministries. Senior Associate Juliania Serrano will continue to oversee our Peace and Justice work through All Saints' Office for Creative Connections. We also have some exciting offerings coming up in the Forum – keep an eye on "This Week at All Saints" for the latest news.

All Saints is a community in motion – a healthy and vibrant movement for social change. When our next Rector is called, he or she will have to hit the ground running to keep up with us. I cannot think of a more beautiful tribute to Ed Bacon's leadership and or a more wonderful way welcome to the next great Rector of All Saints Church.

Money Matters!

- **Tips for Selecting a Financial Advisor:** Financial planners advise their clients on how to save, invest, and increase their money. Like finding a new doctor, finding the right one can seem daunting. Here are a few tips to make the process a little easier:
 - Find someone you trust and are comfortable talking with; someone who is genuinely interested understanding your values and goals, and someone who will offer different or difficult perspectives to consider. Finding an advisor you can work with long-term will also help your long-term strategy.
 - There are numerous certifications available for financial planners. Someone who is a certified financial planner (CFP) is licensed and regulated, and must adhere to continuing financial education and ethical standards. Finding one who is a fiduciary should indicate she or he always has your best interests in mind.
 - Look closely at the advisor's or firm's pay structure. Someone who earns a commission instead of having a flat-fee structure may have incentive to push you toward certain products that may or may not be best suited to fulfill your needs and goals.
 - Just as you should research your advisor and firm (discovering news stories for unethical practices should be big caution), make sure your advisor is knowledgeable about the past while also aware of future market direction.

Every summer, I sit for countless hours at my computer and chose repertoire for the following season. While I listen, I try to keep my mind open for a theme for the spring concert as I concentrate on worship service literature. On the morning of last June 26th, a friend posted a video of the choir "Conspirare" singing a piece called, "I Love You/ What a Wonderful World." It was the morning that marriage equality had become a reality in all 50 states. When I heard the piece, I didn't care how hard it was, I was going to find a way to build a concert around it. That same day, when I expressed my enthusiasm for this equality, a long-time dear friend decided we shouldn't be friends anymore. It hit me hard and yet, it only pushed me towards solidifying an idea for a concert: to feature songs regarding struggle, oppression, justice and hope. I thought deeply about so many struggles that I have not had to endure as a privileged person, and I wanted to bring these struggles to light through song. These songs represent slavery, civil rights, genocide, economic justice and hope for a brighter future. It will not be an easy concert. You will hear quotes and songs that will pull at your heart strings as well as those that will give you hope for our younger generation. Conscientious Projector: Considering a One State Solution to the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

The decades-old failure of negotiations to reach a two-state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict has led disheartened participants on both sides of the divide to reexamine the viability of a one-state approach. In their probing documentary *A People Without a Land*, filmmakers Eliyahu and Pennie Ungar-Sargon offer an illuminating historical overview of the struggle, and visit Israel and the Palestinian territories in the West Bank and Gaza Strip to explore both the challenges and possibilities that a one-state configuration might present. Their interviews with advocates and observers from across the political spectrum reveal skepticism and the ongoing fears, grievances and tensions of the present-day situation, even as they must face the dilemma that a one-state solution might be the only remaining option for peace.


