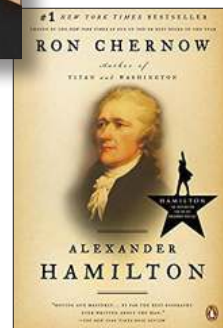

There is a housing crisis in Pasadena, Los Angeles and America. Despite vacancy rates at a 17-year high, more than 61,000 people do not have housing, including people in our own All Saints Community.

Dorothy Edwards, who just a few years ago lived under a freeway overpass and now is one of LA's leading housing advocates, joins us to talk about the
