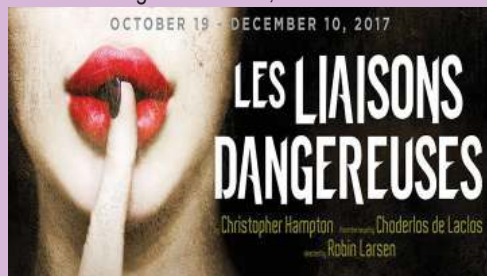
Sunday, Oct. 29, Is Your Last Chance To Purchase Tickets for *With Love and a Major Organ* with Theatre Ministry

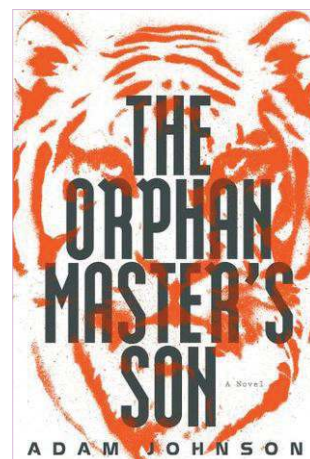

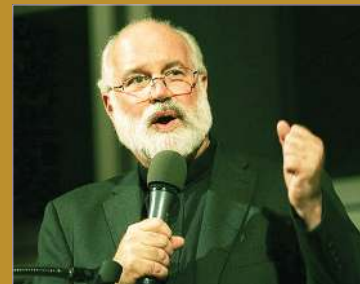
