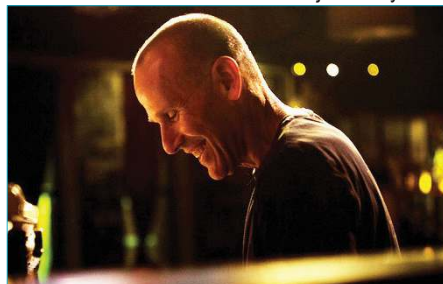
Dementia Care and Senior Social Services

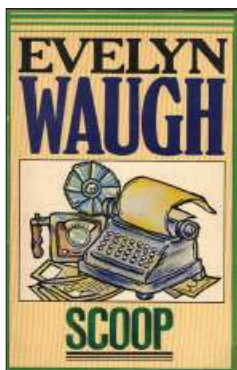

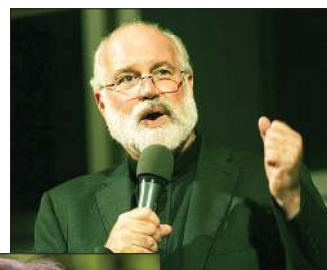

A Streetcar Named Desire

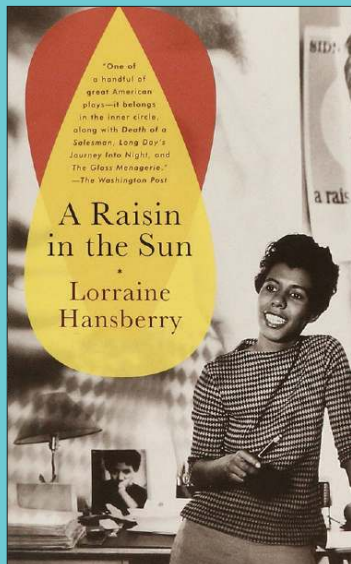
