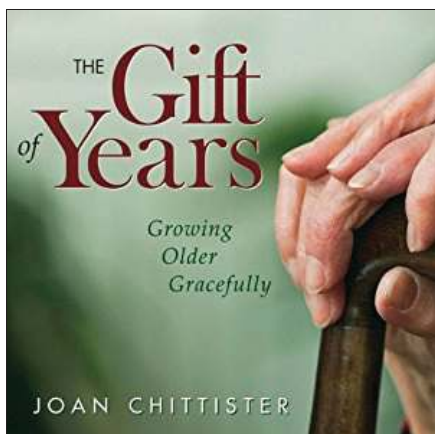

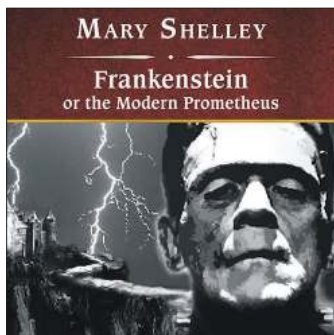

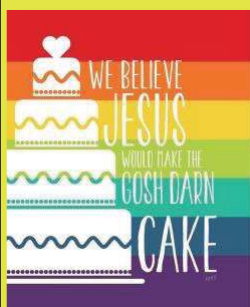

Mary Shelley wrote it as a teenager; she was the daughter of two great individuals, William Godwin and Mary Wollstonecraft, and the wife of another, Percy Bysshe Shelley.
