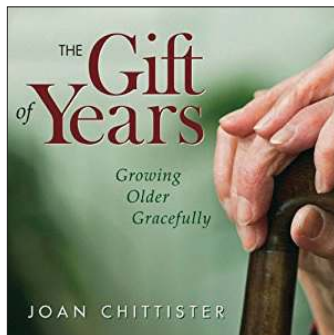

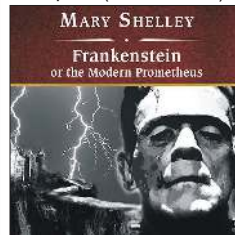

Investigative Journalists: Saving Democracy One Story At A Time



with Harriet Ryan and Matt Hamilton; moderated by John Horn, host of KPCC's "The Frame"

Los Angeles Times investigative reporters Harriet Ryan and Matt Hamilton are two of the journalists who broke the gynecologist scandal at USC.

Since joining the paper in 2008, Harriet Ryan has written about high-profile people, including Phil Spector, Michael Jackson and Britney Spears, and institutions, including USC, the Catholic Church, the Kabbalah Centre and Purdue Pharma, the manufacturer of OxyContin.

Matt Hamilton has covered legal affairs, crime and breaking news across California. He joined The Times in 2013 as an intern reporting on criminal trials in Los Angeles County. Hamilton was part of the team of reporters that received a Pulitzer Prize for its coverage of the 2015 terrorist attack in San Bernardino.
