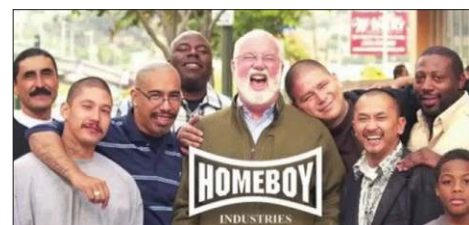

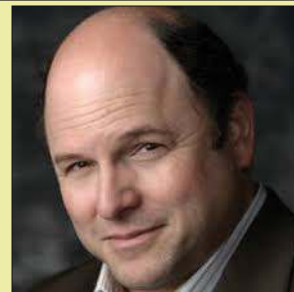

But whether or not you know Shakespeare or Shylock, this provocative new work plays between the gaps in the classic tale to expose the realities of Jewish history. Sarah Mantell's time-bending story, rich with humor and heartbreak, bridges the 16th century with today and beyond. What do we lose or gain by leaving our own culture? And what sacrifices does love demand of fathers and daughters, lovers and friends? *Everything That Never Happened* is a play about disguise, assimilation, pomegranates, and everything Shakespeare left out.

As Gray descends into self-indulgent debauchery, those around him are drawn to their own ruin like moths to a
