Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 Book of Common Prayer. The readings are from the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible, lectionary year B, as well as from The Message and from Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures and New Testament published by Priests for Equality.

Assisted listening devices are available at the Archive Ministry table on the lawn, for use at the 9:00 and 11:15 services and Rector's Forum.

We ask that you extend a respectful courtesy to others by silencing all cell phones prior to entering the church.

Our choir anthems and several congregational hymns this morning connect us to faith communities across the country that today are participating in Concert Across America to End Gun Violence.



A Reading from James (3:13–4:3, 7–8a).


If there are any wise and learned among you, let them show it by good living — with humility, and with wisdom in their actions. But if you have the bitterness of jealousy or self-seeking ambition in your hearts, be careful or you will find yourself becoming arrogant and covering up the truth with lies. This kind of "wisdom" does not come from above. It is earthbound, animal-like and demonic. Where there is jealousy and ambition, there is also disharmony and wickedness of every kind. The wisdom from above, however, has purity as its essence. It works for peace; it is kind and considerate. It is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good. Nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness. Where do these conflicts and battles among you first start? Do they not come from the desires that battle within you? You want something but do not get it, so you are prepared to kill to get it. You have ambitions that you cannot satisfy, so you fight to get your way by force. The reason you do not have what you want is that you do not ask for it in prayer. And when you do ask and do not get it, it is because you have not prayed properly. You have prayed in order to indulge your own pleasures. Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the Devil, and it will flee from you. Draw near to God, and God will draw near to you.





Gluten-free wafers, grape juice and smaller communion cups for those with difficulty swallowing are available on either back side rail.

Members of our Healing Ministry are available in the Chapel and Baptistery during communion for all who wish to receive prayers and the laying on of hands. All prayers are kept confidential. If you desire follow-up, please contact our pastoral care department.

If you have any questions or are confused about any of this, please just ask anyone near you and they will be happy to help.






