The Rt. Rev. Diane M. Jardine Bruce was elected seventh bishop suffragan of the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles in 2009, after having served 10 years as rector of St. Clement's by-the-Sea Church in San Clemente, California. The first woman to be elected



bishop in diocesan history. Bishop Bruce's areas of specialization include multicultural ministries, stewardship, and oversight of the congregations in the southern third of the Diocese.
