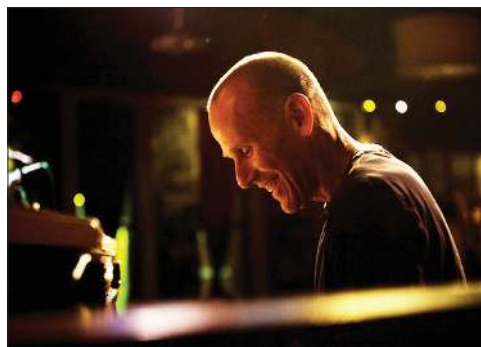

Jazz Vespers: Russell Ferrante

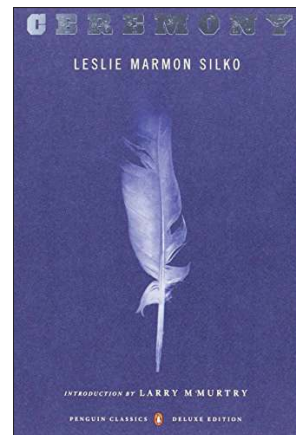

Fiction Fun! Reads Ceremony by Leslie Marmon Silko

Friday, Feb. 22, 7:30–9:00 p.m. in the Guild Room. More than thirty-five years since its original publication, *Ceremony* remains one of the most profound and moving works of Native American literature, a novel that is itself a ceremony of healing. Tayo, a World War II veteran of mixed ancestry, returns to the Laguna Pueblo Reservation. He is deeply scarred by his experience as a prisoner of the Japanese and further wounded by the rejection he encounters from his people. Only by immersing himself in the Indian past can he begin to regain the peace that was taken from him. Masterfully written, filled with the somber majesty of Pueblo myth, *Ceremony* is a work of enduring power. 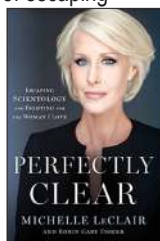
