We welcome the Reverend angel kyodo williams. Zen Buddhist priest, author of *Being Black: Zen and the Art of Living with Fearlessness and Grace* and internationally known speaker and spiritual leader.

Rev. williams will lead an all day workshop entitled: **Radical Dharma: Connecting Race, Love & Liberation** from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Radical Dharma refers to "Complete Truth." It is an urgent invitation for us to personally and collectively reckon with the pain and separation passed down by our nation's legacy of racial injustice, white supremacy and their interlocking oppressions - an inheritance which manifests to this day in our communities, policies, and families. Taking its cues from the book of the same name, Radical Dharma advocates a "new dharma" that deconstructs rather than amplifies systems of suffering, empowering us to reconnect with a more complete truth about our society and our selves, paving the way towards a path of greater belonging to each other and justice for all.

During this workshop you will:

- Learn the power of connecting in bold, authentic and inclusive spaces.
- Be introduced to an embodied method of building internal capacity.
- Unearth myths that deny the history and context of our social conditioning and their impact on you.
- Gain insight into the location race has in maintaining other forms of oppression.
- Learn to recognize and disrupt the "politics of dis-belonging" that short circuits organic compassion and prevents true connection with ourselves and others.

Conscientious Projector: Being the Change: A New Kind of Climate



Fiction Fun! Reads Ceremony by Leslie Marmon Silko

Friday, Feb. 22, in the Guild Room 7:30–9:00 p.m. More than thirty-five years since its original publication, *Ceremony* remains one of the most profound



and moving works of Native American literature, a novel that is itself a ceremony of healing. Tayo, a World War II veteran of mixed ancestry, returns to the Laguna Pueblo Reservation. He is deeply scarred by his experience as a prisoner of the Japanese and further wounded

by the rejection he encounters from his people. Only by immersing himself in the Indian past can he begin to regain the peace that was taken from him. Masterfully written, filled with the somber majesty of Pueblo myth, *Ceremony* is a work of enduring power. Called "the most intriguing African-American Buddhist" by *Library Journal*, angel Kyodo williams is an author, activist, master trainer and founder of *Transformative Change*. She has been bridging the worlds of transformation and justice since her critically acclaimed book, *Being Black: Zen and the Art of Living With Fearlessness and Grace* was hailed as "an act of love" by Pulitzer Prize winner Alice Walker, and "a classic" by Buddhist pioneer Jack Kornfield. Her newest work, *Radical Dharma: Talking Race, Love & Liberation*, is igniting communities to have the long overdue conversations necessary to become more awake and aware of what hinders liberation of self and society.
