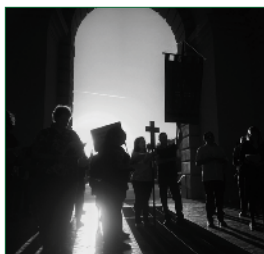
Friday, April 19

The Great Three Hours

This Sunday, Apr. 14, we will march out of the church, cross Euclid and march down Thurgood



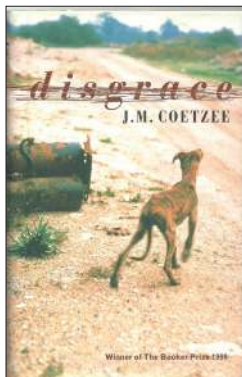

There will be seating on the plaza side of the church for those who do not wish to march but want to view the first part of the dramatic telling of the Gospel, which will take place on the steps.

Fiction Fun! Reads *Disgrace* by J.M. Coetzee

Friday, Apr. 26, 7:30 – 9:00 p.m. in the Guild Room. *Disgrace* was a Booker prize winner in 1999, making J.M. Coetzee the first writer to win the trophy twice (first with *Life & Times of Michael K*). In 2003, he was also awarded the Nobel prize in literature. But beyond the awards, Coetzee is notable as a great South African writer who, together with Breyten Breytenbach and the late André Brink, grappled with the savage complexity of the apartheid and post-apartheid years. Coetzee also took the novel in English into new imaginative and moral territory. From his many outstanding works of fiction, *Disgrace* is unquestionably his masterpiece. 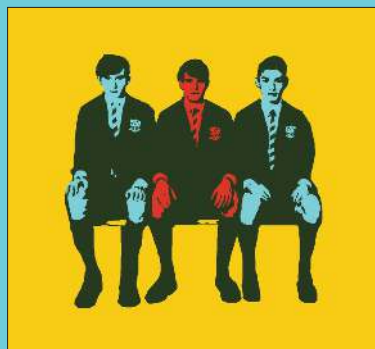

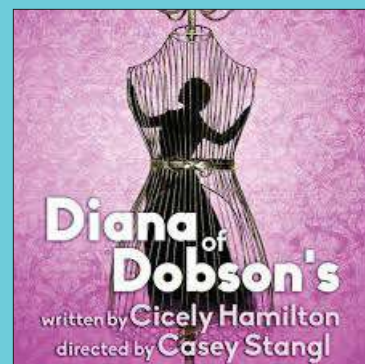
