THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER

All Saints Church, Pasadena

April 20, 2019 at 7:30 p.m.

The Great Vigil of Easter is the culmination of the sacred journey of Holy Week and the beginning of the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. In it the story of redemption unfolds in scripture and sacrament. The service begins in darkness and proceeds to a joyous burst of light, celebrating the passing from death to life.

As we baptize new Christians into the Body of Christ, we listen to the historic record of God's relationship with humanity through biblical stories that are our heritage. And we gather at the table to receive the bread and wine made holy, strength for the journey to go out to be the Body of Christ in the world.

LIGHTING OF THE PASCHAL* CANDLE

The people assemble around the place of the fire. A fire is kindled, and the rector addresses the people saying:

Mike Kinman

Minister: Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites its members throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, through the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in word and sacrament, our faith and hope are renewed and we share in Christ's victory over death.

Let us pray.

O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and inflame us with new hope; purify our minds by this Easter celebration and bring us to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Paschal Candle represents the risen Christ. It is marked with various signs, representing the cross for Christ's death, five wounds, Alpha and Omega (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet) as a title used for Christ, and the calendar year, showing that Christ, sanctifies the present year.

As these signs are traced on the candle, the following is said:

Christ yesterday and today
the Beginning and the End
Alpha and Omega.
All times belong to Christ
and all the ages
and to Christ be the glory and dominion
through all ages of eternity. Amen.

The Candle is lighted from the newly blessed fire.

Priest: May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the deep shadows of our hearts and minds.

The lighted Paschal Candle is carried in procession into the back of the church. The congregation follows the procession into the church and takes their seat.

When all are seated, the cantor will process, pausing three times to sing:




All remain standing for the singing of the Exultet. The acolytes will light take light from the Christ candle and distribute it to the congregation.

Minister: Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the victory of our mighty God.

Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendor, for darkness has been vanquished by our eternal God.


Rejoice and be glad now, Mother Church, and let your holy courts in radiant light resound with the praises of your people.

This is the night when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave. Holy Creator, accept our evening sacrifice, the offering of this candle in your honor. May it shine continually to drive away all darkness. May Christ, the Morning Star who knows no setting, find it ever burning—who gives light to all creation, and who lives and







Priest: The Story Continues in the Good News of Jesus as written in Luke (24:1–12).


People: Glory is yours, O Christ.

On the first day of the week, at the sign of dawn, the women came to the tomb bringing the spices they had prepared. They found the stone rolled back from the tomb; but when they entered the tomb, they did not find the body of Jesus. While they were still at a loss over what to think of this, two figures in dazzling garments stood beside them. Terrified, the women bowed to the ground. The two said to them, "Why do you search for the Living One among the dead? Jesus is not here; Christ has risen. Remember what Jesus said to you while still in Galilee — that the Chosen One must be delivered into the hands of sinners and be crucified, and on the third day would rise again." With this reminder, the words of Jesus came back to them. When they had returned from the tomb, they told all these things to the eleven and the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but the story seemed like nonsense and they refused to believe them. Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. He stooped down, but he could see nothing but the wrappings. So he went away, full of amazement at what had occurred.

THE STORY OF HOLY BAPTISM

INTRODUCTION Seated. Mike Kinman

Priest: Beloved in Christ, Holy Baptism makes us members of Christ's body, the Church. Throughout our lives we wear, invisible on our foreheads, the holy oil, the cross of Christ that marks us as disciples. We have been grafted into Christ's body, so we have suffered with Christ and share in Christ's resurrection. Wherever we go, we bear the mark of Christ signed on our foreheads and engraved on our hearts.

Tonight we welcome new disciples through baptism; we welcome those who bring their baptism to this parish; and we welcome all those who pursue the spiritual journey at All Saints Church. May we so live our lives together in imitation of Christ that we honor our baptismal covenant with Christ and one another and the world for which Christ died.

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

Priest: The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented. Sponsors: I present *Name* to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Priest: Do you desire to be baptized?

Priest: Do you renounce Satan, the evil powers of this world and all sinful desires that draw you from the

love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Priest: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Christ as your Savior?

Answer: I do.

Priest: Do you put your whole trust in Christ's grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Priest: Do you promise to follow and obey Christ as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

The congregation stands – all who are able; the priest addresses the congregation.

their life in Christ?

People: We will.

The priest blesses the water, first saying:

Priest: God dwells in you.

People: And also in you.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of

creation. Through it you led the people of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the messiah. In the water of baptism we are reborn by the Holy Spirit and share in Christ's resurrection. We now bring into the community those who come to Christ in faith.

Sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of the Holy Spirit, that those who are marked as

Christ's own forever may embody God's love and justice throughout their lives.

People: Amen.

The congregation is seated.

BAPTISM

The candidates and sponsors gather around the baptismal font. The candidates are presented by name to the Rector, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying:

Priest: Name, I baptize you in the name of the Creator, the Redeemer, and the Sustainer.

People: Amen.

The priest places a hand on each person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the Cross, and saying to each one:

Priest: Name, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

People: Amen.

Then the priest hands the candidate a candle which is lighted from the Paschal Candle.

Receive the light of Christ and be Christ's light in the world.

When all have been baptized, the congregation stands – all who are able.

Priest: Let us pray.

Almighty God, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have raised these persons to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O God, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

People: Amen.

Priest: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Priest and People:

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim Christ's resurrection, and share with us in Christ's eternal priesthood.

AFFIRMATION OF NAME

Priest: We are here to affirm the name of Daniella Roberta Baker. Each name symbolizes all that you are becoming through the grace of God. We honor the other names you have lived by. We release them into your history and acknowledge that the time has come to declare a new name. This name is the culmination of a journey of discovery and, at the same time, its beginning.

The priest addresses the congregation.

Priest: Will you do all in your power to assist Daniella Roberta to maintain justice, to do what is right, and

to live fully into the person that God has created them to be?

People: We will.

Priest: Dynamic and holy God, we remember how you changed the names of Abraham and Sarah, as they set out to follow you. We know that you changed the name of Jacob, after a long night of wrestling with you. We now declare publicly and affirm the name you have bestowed upon Daniella.

The Priest lays hands upon the person's head.







CONSECRATION *Kneeling or standing – all who are able.*

Priest: From your love and in your image you created us, breathing your spirit into the dust of the earth. When we failed to live in love, you loved us anyway, refusing to let us go. In Jesus of Nazareth you showed us what we might become. In miracle and mystery Jesus was born, as we are born, and lived as we might live.

In the fullness of his life, Jesus revealed the self-centeredness of our lives. So we sought to silence him. But we could not. The resurrection and ascension revealed the indestructible power of God's inexhaustible love.

On the night before Jesus died he shared a meal with his disciples. He took a loaf of bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take. Eat. This is my body that I share with you. Remember me whenever you eat, and offer your food and yourselves to the world."

After supper, Jesus took a cup of wine. When he had blessed it, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink, all of you. This is my blood of forgiveness that I share with you and with all. Remember me whenever you drink, and forgive."

Priest and People:

Now, gracious God, we offer our thanks for this bread and wine, the fruit of field and vine, and the body and blood of self-offering and compassion. We pray that the presence of your Holy Spirit will sanctify our meal, that we, like Christ, may love, heal, forgive and speak truth to all people. Amen.

Priest: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, in the language of your heart, we are bold to say,

Priest and People:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

A period of silence is kept, during which the priest breaks the consecrated bread.

People: We will love one another as Christ loves us. Alleluia!

INVITATION

Priest: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey of faith, there is a place for you at Christ's table. When it comes time for communion, everyone of any age is welcome to receive either communion or a blessing.

If you wish to receive communion (the bread and wine), when you come to the front you may stand or kneel. Hold your hands together in front of you to receive the bread, help guide the cup to your lips or, if you prefer not to receive the wine, touch the cup when it is presented to you.


If you wish to receive a blessing, when you come to the front you may stand or kneel. Cross your arms over your chest, and you will be offered a blessing.




