Fiction Fun! Reads Disgrace

by J.M. Coetzee

7:30 – 9:00 p.m. (Guild Room) *Disgrace* was a Booker prize winner in 1999, making J.M. Coetzee the first writer to win the trophy twice (first with Life & Times of Michael K). In 2003, he was also awarded the Nobel prize in literature. But beyond the awards, Coetzee is nota-



ble as a great South African writer who, together with Breyten Breytenbach and the late André Brink, grappled with the savage complexity of the apartheid and post-apartheid years. Coetzee also took the novel in English into new imaginative and moral territory. From his many outstanding works of fiction, *Disgrace* is unquestionably his masterpiece. 




