
# **Conscientious Projector: Living in the Future's Past**

A prodigious talent at the piano earned him public performances by age six, and at sixteen he was admitted to the USC Community School of the Performing Arts, earning a Bachelor of Music degree in Composition under the tutelage of Robert Linn and Morten Lauridsen.
