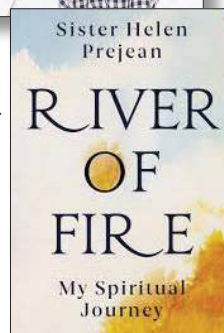

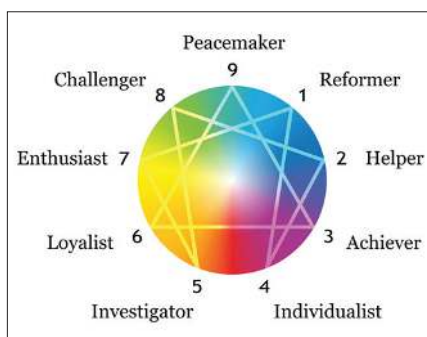
Small Groups
