Training for Leading a Ministry or Committee

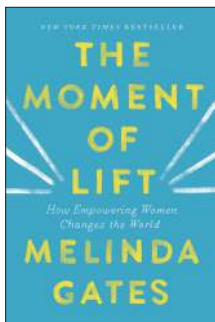

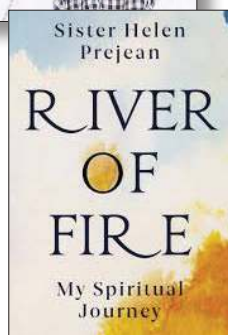

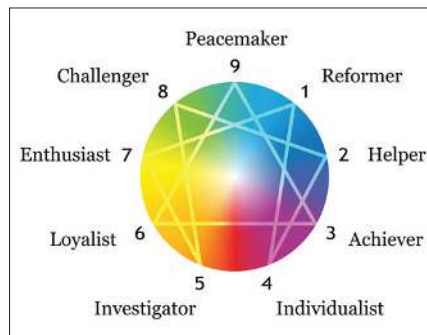

Bring Your Pets to Church for a Blessing Sunday, September 29

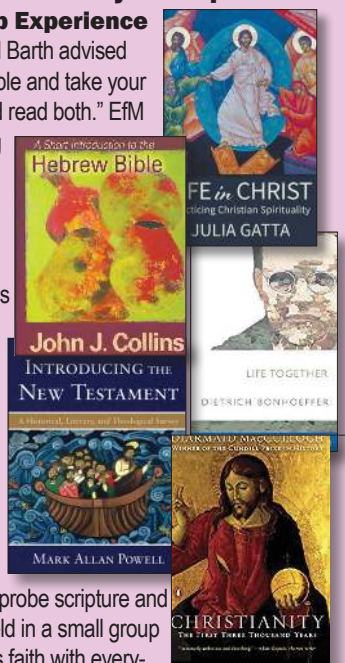
