The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. in Sweetland Hall by the Rector. Following a period of silence, Kinman asked the vestry to focus on positive good news about ASC and then the negative news or lost joy. The vestry shared and then read the values together as part of the opening prayer.

Visitor Welcome – Kinman welcomed the visitors and asked them to introduce themselves.

#### **BUSINESS ITEMS**

## Approval of new vestry member Thomas Diaz

Kinman shared that Derek Wan has resigned from the vestry due to work commitments. He introduced Thomas Diaz and Diaz shared his journey at ASC. It was then moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously approved Thomas Diaz to the vestry.

## Approval of the Consent Agenda

Report of the Clerk and Committee Reports: It was moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously approved the consent agenda including the minutes and committee reports as received.

#### Report of the Treasurer

Albarano reported that the financials are in the black. Two major film shoots have been very helpful as has the savings from open positions. We have received 49% of budgeted pledges.

## **Vestry Nominating Committee**

Ahart thanked the vestry for their response to her request for nominees. The nomination form will go to the parish for nominations. The nominating committee is outgoing vestry members Shelley De Leon, Grey Ingrassia, Tony Jackson, Cathy Keig, Judy Van Vleet and Trula Worthy-Clayton; wardens MaryAnn Ahart and Steve Williams; at-large parish members Gloria Pitzer, Chris Folz, Carlos Carrillo, Rhonda Johnson; and staff Mike Kinman, Christina Honchell and Terry Knowles. The nominees will be announced in January in Saints Alive.

## Racial Justice Advisory Board (RJAB) Report

Williams introduced Bonnie Rice, co-chair of RJAB. The comprehensive report was distributed to the vestry. Rice shared the history of RJAB and the goals were reviewed. She reviewed the status

of the recommendations and the work not yet begun. She encouraged the vestry and parish to read *No Ashes in the Fire: Coming of Age Black & Free in America* by Darnell L. Moore. A parish discussion on the book will be held on September 29. Kinman thanked the committee and Bonnie Rice for her report. He encouraged the vestry to read and join in the discussion.

## Personal Data Sharing Policy

Kinman shared the draft of the Personal Data Sharing Policy. It was moved, and seconded, and then there was extensive discussion on ethics, types of data, safeguards and security. Following the discussion it was moved to table the policy until the next meeting. The vestry approved tabling the policy until October.

# Fall Giving Campaign

Knowles distributed the giving report. As of this report, the YTD variance from the budget is a \$35 K improvement. The Legacy Wall celebration was held September 5. The Giving campaign will launch in October. All vestry will receive their ask letters and are asked to pledge by the October 1 vestry meeting. Kinman asked the vestry to consider what a leadership gift looks like.

# <u>Determining our Values, Mission and Vision</u>

Robinson shared the draft mission statement. It was read and reviewed, then it was moved, seconded and following deep, extensive discussion, the vestry unanimously approved the mission statement. Kinman shared that our interfaith friends reviewed and also endorsed the mission statement. Kinman thanked the drafting committee and co-chair Tony Jackson for their work.

#### Address Serious Staffing Capacity Issues

Mejia reported that we have hired a new associate rector: Alfredo Feregrino. He will begin November 1. There will be interviews for the second position in mid October. A transition team is working to make this a welcoming move for our new associate rectors.

## Provide Safe, Welcoming Space for Ministry

Albarano reported that PACES is refining the options for campus improvement and will bring it to the vestry in Spring 2020. Albarano and Kinman encouraged the vestry and parishioners to attend the PACES campus tours. Kinman shared that he has been meeting with Mayor Terry Tornek to build relations and better working relations with the city.

# <u>Inspire Congregational Leadership & Development</u>

Naecker reported that they are re-imagining the new member class and renaming it "Getting Connected". The goal is to understand core values, build relationships, connect with groups and build active participation. Everyone is invited to get connected. Next class begins October 6. They have had training with the Greeters and Ushers on building a welcoming environment. They are working on a leaders' guide. Kinman shared that they had a Welcome Café this past Sunday.

#### **WARDENS' REPORT**

No report this month and no executive session this evening. Christine Hartman hosted the Youth Dinner and contributions from vestry members to defray the cost are welcome. She asked for a volunteer to lead the next Youth Dinner on April 20. Phillips has designed the vestry nametags. Please wear them each Sunday and be a presence on the lawn.

#### **RECTOR'S REPORT**

Kinman shared that he encouraged the vestry to read *No Ashes in the Fire: Coming of Age Black & Free in America*. He is going to the Episcopal Divinity School at Union Seminary with Juliana Serrano to meet with students. He will meet with Dean Kelly Brown Douglas and author Darnell Moore to build a partnership with the seminary and ASC. He encouraged the vestry to join the book study at the end of the month.

Kinman shared that research on fundraising in non-white communities is being conducted. Erin Weber-Johnson will be here October 1-2 to meet with faith leaders in non-white communities regarding fundraising.

Kinman shared that we will have a theologian, The Rev. Wil Gafney, in residence for a month in November. She is on her sabbatical and is working on a new lectionary centering on women in scripture. We are looking for someone to provide housing.

Kinman shared that they are looking at revisioning the Rector's Forum. It will relaunch in January.

  - If it starts at 6, allow people to start eating at 6? Hard to keep younger kids at bay as they were hungry. Then it would keep the lines down once choir gets out?
- Summer Adventure theme is "Who Is My Neighbor". Enrollment is low, please encourage people to sign up.
   Kelly asked for additional possibilities for volunteer opportunities during the week.
