Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*. The readings are from the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible, lectionary year A, as well as from *The Message*, *Enfleshed*, *The Voice*, and from *Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures* and *New Testament* published by Priests for Equality.



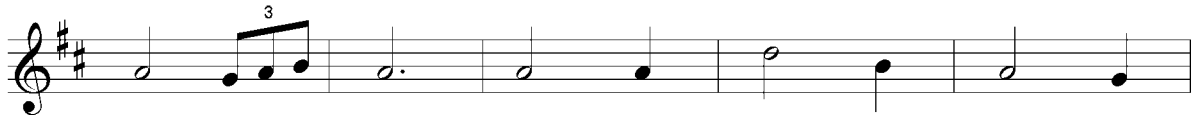
Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for the shepherd, whose voice the sheep hear, calling each one by name and leading them out. Having brought them out, the shepherd goes on ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know the shepherd's voice. The sheep will not follow a stranger, but they will run away because they do not know the voice of strangers." 

In our arrogance, we lost touch with the breath of God within us, with the divinity of the creation, growing blind to its beauty and deaf to its harmonies. But through Christ, born of a woman, your deep abiding love reclaimed us and realigned us with the grain of the universe.

On that evening in an upper room, with his friends around him, our brother Jesus blessed the bread, broke it, and shared it with all who were gathered: This bread is my body, an offering of God's love for all. When you eat it, remember me. Taking the cup of wine, he blessed it and shared it with all who were gathered: This wine is my blood, God's promise of new life for all. When you drink it, remember me.

God, in the memory of Jesus who healed people and washed his disciples' feet, who loved children and honored outcasts, who fed people and turned water into wine, who died and rose to new and unending life, we ask that you breathe on this bread and this wine, filling them with the transforming power of the cosmic Christ.

Priest and People:

Breathe through us, God, that our bodies, minds, and spirits may be filled with your life-giving presence. Make us again a holy people, strongly bound to you, firmly rooted in the earth, with eyes to see all life as sacred. Empower us to spread the light of Christ in our wondrous and confusing world. Amen.

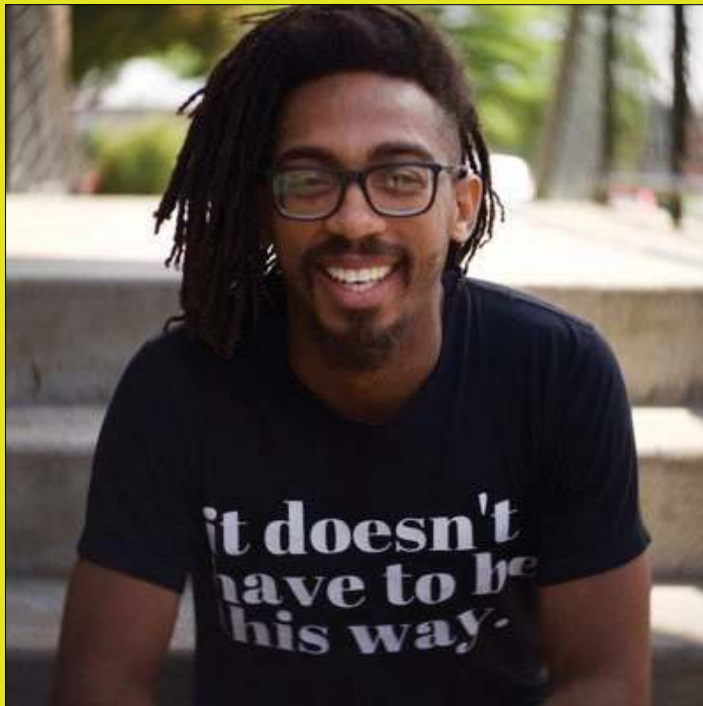
Scott Budnick Joins Us For Our Rector's Forum at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, May 10

Despite a red-hot career **Scott Budnick** abruptly left the film business in 2013 to start a prisoner-advocacy nonprofit. He recently returned to film-making with a vision to pair storytelling with real-world impact. In 2013, Budnick launched the Anti-Recidivism Coalition (ARC), which advocates for policy change and provides mentoring for the incarcerated and recently released. ARC helped get 14

bills signed into law by former California Gov. Jerry Brown, including one that gives a shot at freedom to 20,000 juveniles sentenced to life without parole. But Budnick, 43, couldn't quite shake his storytelling roots: In 2018, as an offshoot of ARC, the Atlanta native created production banner One Community. Its first project, Warner Bros. *Just Mercy*, based on the book of world-renowned civil rights defense attorney Bryan Stevenson works to free a wrongly condemned death row prisoner.



Budnick was inspired to bring prisoners' stories to film and TV not long after starting ARC. "I met a guy at a party who was involved in the marriage equality movement and asked him what was the game-changing moment," Budnick recalls. "He said, 'Will & Grace, Ellen DeGeneres, Glee, Modern Family, Milk.' That was a decade of content that changed people's hearts and minds and how they voted throughout the country or just made them less dug-in against gay marriage. When I heard that, I realized that I'm able to really scale the work we're doing by raising money for a film and television company."



We Welcome Back Andre Henry Preaching at 11:15 a.m. on Sunday, May 17

After watching a black man bleed to death on Face Book Live in 2016, I decided (if you can call it that) to lug a 100-pound granite boulder around Los Angeles for 6 months, to demonstrate the burden that systemic racism lays on the black psyche. I took it to work, to class, on job interviews, to dinner with friends—everywhere—singing as I went. That path has led me through the work of great freedom fighters of the past like Gandhi and Mandela and Martin Luther King. All of this searching

has shown me that history isn't a story that's happening to us, but one we're writing together. Therefore, we don't have to feel helpless about the overwhelming brokenness in the world. We have the power to take meaningful action.
