Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*. The readings are from the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible, lectionary year A, as well as from *The Message, Enfleshed, The Voice,* and from *Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures* and *New Testament* published by Priests for Equality.







LESSON Terry Moore

A Reading from Genesis (18: 1–15, 21:1–7).

The Lord appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. Abraham looked up and saw three travelers standing nearby. When he saw them, he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and bowed low to the ground. He said, "If I have found favor in your eyes, my lord, do not pass your servant by. Let a little water be brought, and then you may all wash your feet and rest under this tree. Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way – now that you have come to your servant." "Very well," they answered, "do as you say." So Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah. "Quick," he said, "get three seahs of fine flour and knead it and bake some bread." Then he ran to the herd and selected a choice, tender calf and gave it to a servant, who hurried to prepare it. He then brought some curds and milk and the calf that had been prepared, and set these before them. While they ate, he stood near them under a tree. "Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him. "There, in the tent," he said. Then the Lord said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a child." Now Sarah was listening at the entrance to the tent, which was behind him. Abraham and Sarah were already old and well advanced in years, and Sarah was past the age of childbearing. So Sarah laughed to herself as she thought, "Now that I am so old and my husband even older, is pleasure to come my way again?" Then the Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Will I really have a child, now that I am old?' Is anything too hard for the Lord? I will return to you at the appointed time next year and Sarah will have a child." Sarah was afraid, and said, "I didn't laugh." God said, "Oh, but you did indeed laugh!"

Our God was gracious to Sarah as it had been foretold, and did what had been promised. Sarah conceived and gave birth to a child for Abraham, who was now in old age, at the very time God had promised. They named the child Isaac, and Abraham circumcised the child Isaac when he was eight days old, according to God's command. Abraham was a hundred years old when Sarah gave birth to Isaac. Sarah said, "Now God has given me laughter, and all who hear this will laugh with me." She also said, "Who would have said to Abraham that Sarah would suckle children? Yet I have given Abraham a child in his old age."

A Reading from Romans (5:1–8).

Now, since we have been made right in God's sight by our faith, we are at peace with God through our Savior Jesus Christ. Because of our faith, Christ has brought us to the grace in which we now stand, and we confidently and joyfully look forward to the day on which we will become all that God has intended. But not only that – we even rejoice in our afflictions! We know that affliction produces perseverance; and perseverance produces character; and character, hope. And such a hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. At the appointed time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for us godless people. It is not easy to die for a good person – though of course for someone really worthy, there might be someone prepared to die – but the proof of God's love is that Christ dies for us even while we were sinners.


Minister: The Good News of Jesus as written in Matthew (9:35–10:8).

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kindom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then Jesus said to the disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into this harvest." Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed Jesus. These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kindom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment."

On the night before he died, Jesus sat at table with his friends. He took the bread, gave you thanks, and broke it and shared it with them, saying, "Take, eat; this bread is my Body, given to set you free. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, gave you thanks, and shared it with them, saying, "This is my Blood, the sign of the new covenant, given to set you free. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering his love for us, his labor to give us new life, and his defeat of death, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Priest and People:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Priest: Now, Creator God, breathe your Spirit upon these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be for us the food and drink of new life, Christ's Body and Blood given for us. Send your Spirit upon us, that our lives may be transformed into Gospel wine. Strengthen us by this holy food and drink to be your people, united to one another and to you.

Through Christ our Savior, in the power of the Holy Spirit, we give you glory and praise, Creator God, now and forever. *Amen.*

Priest: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, in the language of your heart, we are bold to say,

Priest and People:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.




