This Sunday we are responding to the outrageous use of federal officers in Portland, OR against what are for the most part peaceful protestors. The use of these officers is violating the constitutional rights of the protestors and the sovereign rights of the state of Oregon as the Constitution vests police powers in the states. Even more concerning, these officers are operating as a secret police. News reports have stated that these federal officers are from the U.S. Marshals Service, Customs and Border Patrol, and other agencies of the Department of Homeland Security, but they are operating in Portland without wearing any identification as to who they are and what agencies they represent. Furthermore, they are detaining people without identifying themselves or even informing them as to why they are being detained. To make matters even worse, it has been reported that the Trump Administration is planning to send similar forces to several other American cities. Our democracy and our basic rights and freedoms are at risk like never before. One of the things we can do is urge Congress to do everything they can to oppose this assault on our constitutional values and dismantle these paramilitary forces.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. The readings are from the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible, lectionary year A, as well as from *The Message*, *Enfleshed*, *The Voice*, and from *Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures* and *New Testament* published by Priests for Equality.

LESSON

Lilli Cloud

A Reading from Romans (8:26–39).

The Spirit, too, comes to help us in our weakness. For we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit expresses our plea with groanings too deep for words. And God, who knows everything in our hearts, knows perfectly well what the Spirit is saying, because her intercessions for God's holy people are made according to the mind of God. We know that God makes everything work together for the good of those who love God and have been called according to God's purpose. They are the ones God chose long ago, predestined to share the image of the Only Begotten, in order that Christ might be the firstborn of many. Those God predestined have likewise been called; those God called have also been justified; and those God justified have, in turn, been glorified. What should be our response? Simply this: "If God is for us, who can be against us? Since God did not spare the Only Begotten, but gave Christ up for the sake of us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that God will freely give us everything. Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? Since God is the One who justifies, who has the power to condemn? Only Christ Jesus, who died—or rather, was raised—and sits at the right hand of God, and who now intercedes for us! What will separate us from the love of Christ? Trouble? Calamity? Persecution? Hunger? Nakedness? Danger? Violence? As scripture says, "For your sake, we are being killed all day long; we are looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered." Yet in all this we are more than conquerors because of God who has loved us. For I am certain that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, neither heights nor depths—nor anything else in all creation—will be able to separate us from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, our Savior.

It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all – it becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come to perch in its branches." CONSECRATION

Priest: Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Creator of all.

Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect self-offering for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."





With a Grammy on his shelf and eight additional nominations, artists such as Diana Krall, Paul McCartney, Gladys Knight, Queen Latifah, and Charles Aznavour vie for a spot on his crowded calendar. Career highlights include arranging the 'Star Spangled Banner' for Whitney Houston's performance at Super Bowl 1990 (the recording went platinum), playing bass on Paul McCartney's CD "Kisses On The Bottom," and numerous recordings with Diana Krall, the Clayton Brothers, the Clayton-Hamilton Jazz Orchestra, Milt Jackson, Monty Alexander and many others.



Gerald Clayton searches for honest expression in every note he plays. With harmonic curiosity and critical awareness, he develops musical narratives that unfold as a result of both deliberate searching and chance uncovering. The four-time GRAMMY-nominated pianist/composer formally began his musical journey at the prestigious Los Angeles County High School for the Arts, and earned a Bachelor of Arts in Piano Performance at USC's Thornton School of Music under the instruction of piano icon Billy Childs. Clayton won second place in the 2006 Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz

Piano Competition. Capturing the truth in each moment's conception of sound comes naturally to Clayton. The son of beloved bass player and composer John Clayton, he enjoyed a familial apprenticeship from an early age. Clayton honors the legacy of his father and all his musical ancestors through a commitment to artistic exploration, innovation, and reinvention.

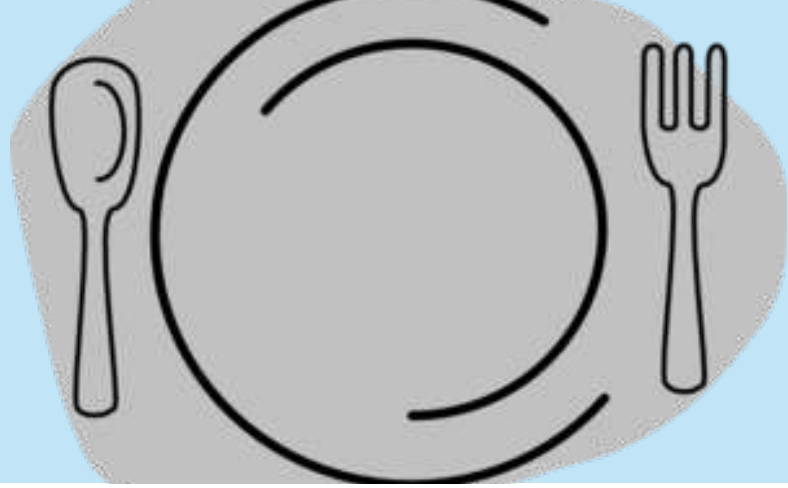

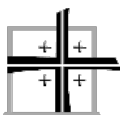
