LESSON Terry Moore

A Reading from Genesis (32:22-31).

In the course of the night, Jacob arose, took the entire caravan, and crossed the ford of the Yabbok River. After Jacob had crossed with all his possessions, he returned to the camp, and he was completely alone. And there, someone wrestled with Jacob until the first light of dawn. Seeing that Jacob could not be overpowered, the other struck Jacob at the socket of the hip, and the hip was dislocated as they wrestled. Then Jacob's contender said, "Let me go, for day is breaking." Jacob answered, "I will not let you go until you bless me." "What is your name?" the other asked. "Jacob" he answered. The other said, "Your name will no longer be called 'Jacob' or 'Heel-Grabber', but 'Israel', 'Overcomer of God' because you have wrestled with both God and mortals and you have prevailed." Then Jacob asked, "Now tell me your name, I beg you." The other asked, "Why do you ask me my name?", and blessed Jacob there.
