### **Each week we put our faith into action: Decertify Abusive Police Officers**

This Sunday we invite you to support SB 731, a bill in the California State Legislature, that will set up a process whereby police officers who abuse their authority and are fired by their police department will also be professionally decertified and prevented from serving as police officers anywhere else in California. Over the last few weeks, hundreds of thousands of Californians have taken to the streets to demand an end to police brutality. Addressing police violence requires re-examining the role of police in our society, and re-imagining how to advance public safety by investing in resources for mental health, domestic violence and other crisis response that do not involve law enforcement. But we still need to hold police officers accountable for abuse. California must create a process to remove abusive police from the streets to protect the people of California and in particular those who are often most targeted by police violence: People of color, LGBTQ individuals, the homeless and those with mental disabilities. SB 731 also strengthens California’s civil rights law, the Bane Act, by removing the requirement that victims of police violence prove that officers had specific intent to violate their civil rights – an impossible bar for most cases. SB 731 would restore the burden of proof to general intent, lowering the barrier for families to seek justice.

A Reading from Genesis (45:3–11, 15).

Joseph was no longer able to hold back his feelings in front of his attendants, and he cried out to them, "Leave me!" So no one was present when he made himself known to his brothers — but he wept so loudly that all of his Egyptian attendants heard him, and the news of it reached the Pharaoh's palace. Joseph said to his brothers, "It is I — Joseph! Is my father really still alive?" The brothers could not answer they were so dumbfounded at his presence. Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me." When they had come closer he said to them, "I am your brother Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt! 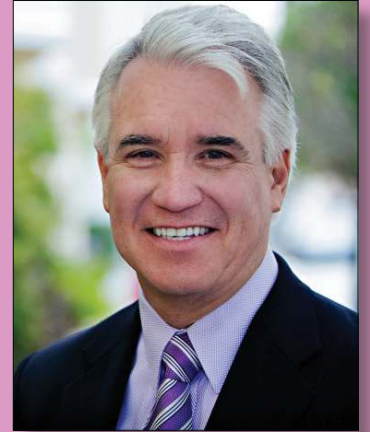

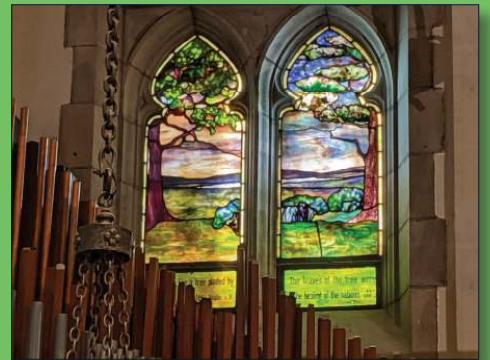
