The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm in Sweetland Hall by the rector. Following a period of silence, Kinman asked the vestry to read Luke 17:6 and focus on trust and how we grow our trust in God. There were small group discussions on leadership and trust. Kinman asked the vestry to read the mission statement aloud. He asked for input about what the vestry is hearing from the parish. Vestry is asked to consider beginning their meetings with reading the mission and values of ASC.

Visitor Welcome – Kinman welcomed the visitors and asked them to introduce themselves.

# **BUSINESS ITEMS**

## Endorsement of Jamie Barnett for Priesthood

Russell reviewed the process and if all aligns the ordination will be on January 11, 2020. Jamie Barnett shared her journey and feelings about the next step. It was moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously endorsed Jamie Barnett for the priesthood.

## Approval of the Consent Agenda

Report of the Clerk and Committee Reports: It was moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously approved the consent agenda including the minutes and committee reports as received.

## Report of the Treasurer

Albarano reported that we are looking good and in the black. ASC is moving into their giving campaign. Knowles reported that vestry pledges are due before the first event at the rectory on Friday. She asked the vestry to attend the rectory event.

## Vestry Nominating Committee

Ahart reported that there are nearly 50 candidates thus far. There is one more Sunday for nominations. She reminded the vestry of the strengths of the retiring vestry and asked the vestry to consider strong nominations.

Racial Justice Advisory Board (RJAB) Report – No further report this month.

## Data Use Policy

Knowles shared the work done since the last vestry meeting and background on the policy. She clearly explained the use of data search and philanthropic screening. She also shared that both volunteers and staff will be signing a confidentiality agreement before accessing any data. It was moved, seconded and following discussion the vestry unanimously approved the revised Data Use Policy. The vestry thanked Knowles for her work on the policy and revisions in response to the first reading in September.

# FOUR FOUNDTIONAL GOALS

# Values, Mission and Vision

Ahart reported that the parish is embracing the mission and work will begin on the vision. The process will begin with the vestry and then the parish. The plan is to complete the process by June. She asked the vestry to read the mission and vision at their committee meetings. She asked that the vestry be visible and open to discussion. This is a chance for centering and reflecting on who we are.

## **Staffing Capacity**

Mejia reported that they are down to two candidates who will have their interviews this month. Kinman shared that Rev. Alfredo Feregrino will be coming on board November 1. He needs a place to live. His family will remain this year in Seattle, as his twins will be graduating high school next spring. The transition team is working to make the transition smooth.

## Welcoming Space

Albarano shared that PACES will have a report for the vestry in April. Jane Brust is part of PACES Communication team. She distributed and thoroughly reviewed the Key Messages for PACES Task Force. The vestry had an opportunity for questions and discussion. They will be on the lawn in November with some concepts and alternatives.

## Leadership & Development

Naecker shared that there have been many opportunities for connections including Getting Connected beginning this Sunday, Homecoming, Celebration of Ministries, and Blessing of the Animals on St. Frances Sunday. The lawn is a work in progress and continues to get feedback and updates. Feast & Friendship is small group opportunities for connecting.

## WARDENS' REPORT

Williams asked the vestry to go online and take the Harvard Bias Test. Please take this test. Dr. Devon Carbone will be here at the Forum this Sunday. There was a great discussion on *No Ashes in the Fire: Coming of Age Black & Free* by Darnell Moore. The live streaming from the Episcopal Divinity School (EDS) from Union Theological Seminary in New York with Darnell Moore, Kelly Douglas, and Mike Kinman was fabulous.

Ahart shared there will be an executive session following this meeting.

## **RECTOR'S REPORT**

Kinman urged all vestry to complete the bias test online. The work done with Moore and Douglas will build a good partnership with EDS and ASC.

Kinman also shared that ASC is hosting a gathering of 6 faith leaders and 16 people with Erin Weber-Johnson. She is working with groups around the country regarding fundraising in non-

white communities. ASC is providing the space and resources for the Southern California gathering.

Save Saturday, October 26 for strategic planning between CEEP (Consortium of Endowed Episcopal Parishes) and ASC. The topic is Strategic Planning for a Changing Church in a Changing World. It will be from 2-4 p.m. with a \$25 fee.

# LOOSE ENDS

- Keig shared that the vestry owes Christine Hartman for the youth dinner. We also need someone to take on leadership of the next vestry youth dinner on April 29.
- Serrano shared that through Refugio Pasadena there is an important opportunity for members of our faith community to serve unaccompanied youth through temporary foster care. There will be an information session this month for interested families. They need 100 families in the community to serve as foster families.
- Diaz shared that he will be traveling to Washington D.C. this Monday to be there when the Supreme Court begins to hear three cases that involve LGBTQ and employment. Diaz will be commissioned this Sunday.
- O'Phelan shared that she continues to work with the Trevor Project and they are having a benefit on Thursday, October 3, in West Hollywood.
