Ministro: Las Buenas Nuevas de Jesucristo como está escrito en San Matteo (22:34–46).

Los fariseos se reunieron al saber que Jesús había hecho callar a los saduceos, y uno, que era maestro de la ley, para tenderle una trampa, le preguntó: —Maestro, ¿cuál es el mandamiento más importante de la ley? Jesús le dijo: —“Ama al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente.” Éste es el más importante y el primero de los mandamientos. Nadie pudo responderle ni una sola palabra, y desde ese día ninguno se atrevió a hacerle más preguntas.

While the Pharisees were gathered around him, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose descendant is the Messiah?" They answered, "David's." Jesus continued, "Then how is it that David, inspired by the Spirit, calls the Messiah 'Sovereign'? For he says, 'The Most High said to my Sovereign, "Sit at my right hand until I place your enemies under your foot."' If David calls the Messiah 'Sovereign,' how can the Messiah be a descendant of David?" No one could reply, and from that day on no one dared ask him any more questions.

All Saints Sunday



New Small Group Offerings, starting Fall 2020 ([register online here](#)):






