Proposition 14 - Authorizes Bonds Continuing Stem Cell Research. Authorizes \$5.5 billion state bonds for: stem cell and other medical research, including training; research facility construction; administrative costs. ALL SAINTS CHURCH (Pasadena) ENDORSES PROP 15 Proposition 15: Increases Funding Sources for Public Schools, Community Colleges and Local Government Services by Changing Tax Assessment of Commercial and Industrial Property. Taxes such properties based on current market value, instead of purchase price. Fiscal Impact: Increased property taxes on commercial properties worth more than \$3 million providing \$6.5 billion to \$11.5 billion in new funding to local governments and schools. Proposition 16: Allows Diversity as a Factor in Public Employment, Education and Contracting Decisions. Permits government decision-making policies to consider race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in order to address diversity by repealing constitutional provision prohibiting such policies. <p>Proposition 20: Restricts Parole for Certain Offenses Currently Considered to be Non-Violent. Authorizes Felony Sentences for Certain Offenses Currently Treated Only as Misdemeanors. <p>Proposition 21: Expands Local Governments' Authority to Enact Rent Control on Residential Property. Allows local governments to establish rent control on residential properties over 15 years old. <p>Proposition 22: Exempts App-Based Transportation and Delivery Companies from Providing Employee Benefits to Certain Drivers. <p>Proposition 23: Establishes State Requirements for Kidney Dialysis Clinics. Requires On-Site Medical Professional. Requires physician, nurse practitioner or physician assistant on site during dialysis treatment. Prohibits clinics from reducing services without state approval. <p>Proposition 24: Amends Consumer Privacy Laws. Permits consumers to: prevent businesses from sharing personal information, correct inaccurate personal information, and limit businesses’ use of “sensitive personal information,” including precise geolocation, race, ethnicity, and health information.
