For Fiscal Year 2021, the Trump Administration has set the refugee admissions ceiling at 15,000. This is the lowest level of refugee admissions since the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program began 40 years ago. The program has historically had an average refugee admissions ceiling of 95,000. The proposed ceiling of 15,000 represents continued efforts to dismantle the historically bipartisan refugee resettlement program. In a world where there are over 29.6 million refugees forced to flee their homes, this severe reduction in admissions will further harm the world's most vulnerable. Offering resettlement to these individuals reflects this nation's highest ideals of freedom and opportunity.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*. The readings are from the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible, lectionary year A, as well as from *The Message, Enfleshed, The Voice,* and from *Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures* and *New Testament* published by Priests for Equality.






GOSPEL

Jesus said, "The Promised One will come in glory, escorted by all the angels and will sit upon the royal throne, with all the nations assembled below. Then the Promised One will separate them from one another, as a shepherd divides the sheep from the goats. The sheep will be placed on the right, the goats on the left. Then ruler will say to those on the right, 'Come, you that are blessed by God, inherit the kindom prepared for you from the creation of the world. The answer will come, 'The truth is, as often as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me.' 


