

A Reading from Isaiah (40:1–11)

"Comfort, oh comfort my people," says your God. "Speak softly and tenderly to Jerusalem, but also make it clear that she has served her sentence, that her sin is forgiven! She's been punished enough." A voice cries out, "Prepare for God's arrival! Make the road straight and smooth, a highway fit for our God.
