Centro de Intercambio y Solidaridad (CIS)

(Building Solidarity with Salvadorans for a Just Society)



Building Solidarity with Salvadorans for a Just Society is a small group of Angelenos and Pasadenans committed to people-to-people solidarity with Salvadorans who struggle for economic, environmental and social justice. For 10 years, we have funded approximately 30 annual high school and university scholarships for a small and poor rural community, San Pablo Tacachico. We do so in coordination with Centro de Intercambio y Solidaridad (CIS), a Salvadoran nonprofit that develops and supports these scholarship communities through grassroots work (www.cis-elsalvador.org).

The CIS scholarship program is not only about academic education – it also focused on the formation of each student for leadership and participation in all aspects of the local, national and global communities. The CIS facilitates a broad education about El Salvador's history and the current economic, political and social reality by involving the communities, elders, and experts.

We have developed strong relationships with CIS and the community of San Pablo Tacachico through regular visits. Every time we visit, we learn from the CIS and the students – their modeling of popular education and Christian-based communities remind us that we also need to continuously question the dominant economic and political reality, understand our place within the national and global economic systems, and imagine and work for a more just world.

We are also reminded how far even a little money can go in El Salvador. Your contribution will go to paying for the transportation to/from school, food and living expenses, school supplies, etc. These funds also help students cope with technical barriers. Due to the COVID crisis, El Salvador has moved most high school and university education online.

All Saints Climate Change Task Force in Support of The United Nations Carbon Offset Platform

MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission of the All Saints Climate Change Task Force is to help the Parish live into the Vestry Resolution to "combat the causes and consequences of anthropogenic (human-caused) climate change".

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT:

UN # 5336 Efficient Cookstoves in Kenya: The project is located in Kenya and provides locally made domestic fuel-efficient cooking stoves to rural The new stoves reduce the amount of wood fuel needed to cook, thereby reducing carbon emissions. The new fuel efficient stoves replace the traditional "3-stone fires", which are thermally inefficient and result in large amounts of smoke and indoor air pollution, which has been linked to a range of health in children. A \$10 donation to this project removes one metric ton of CO₂ from the atmosphere.

UN # 8855 Solar Water Heaters in India: India is gifted with abundant solar resources. However, 90% of urban residents in western India use electricity to heat water. This accounts for 20% to 30% of electricity consumption, which causes a huge financial burden to the families and emits large amounts of carbon dioxide. In a country with about 300 clear sunny days per year, dependence on electricity from fossil fuels represents a major waste of energy. A contribution of \$12.50 to this project removes one metric ton of CO₂ from the atmosphere.

UN # 336 Angkor Bio Cogen Rice Husk Power Project: Angkor Bio Cogen (ABC) project, the first renewable energy project to utilize rice husk as biomass fuel for electricity generation in Cambodia, involves the operation of 2 MW new rice husk power generation plant in the Kandal province.ABC provides the electricity generated from biomass power plant to the Angkor Rice Mill that, in absence of the project activity, uses diesel oil to generate electricity for the rice mill operation. Besides from this, ABC provides surplus electricity to neighboring

factories and community. A contribution of \$3.50 to this project removes one metric ton of CO₂ from the atmosphere.

Our holistic programs treat children, parents, siblings, and other adults to help keep children safe and return individuals and families in crisis to healthy function. - 2) **Foster Care and Adoptions Programs** placing foster children with families, and recruiting, training, certifying and supporting more foster/adoptive families who choose to open their hearts and homes to children in need of loving families;
- 3) **Community-Based Counseling & Support Services** these programs provide a wide range of preventive mental health and related services for individuals and families in crisis in their homes, schools and other community-based settings.

Our Mission Statement

Friends in Deed is an interfaith organization that provides supportive services to meet basic human needs, so our homeless and at-risk neighbors can rebuild their lives.

COMPASSION CONNECTION DIGNITY

The Food Pantry provides food assistance to low-income and no-income families in the greater Pasadena/Altadena area. Our households are made up of "working poor" individuals, senior citizens and people with disabilities on fixed incomes, and those who are experiencing homelessness.

Founded in 2007, **The Women's Room (TWR)** is the only organization in the San Gabriel Valley dedicated to serving women who are alone and homeless or at risk of homelessness. It is a daytime refuge known for wrapping its arms around the 20 to 35 women who come through the door each day, making them feel whole and appreciated. The program includes supportive services and basic needs: a shower, laundry and healthy food.

The Pasadena **Bad Weather Shelter (BWS)** is a Friends In Deed program that provides shelter for homeless individuals during the winter season. For the last few years, the Bad Weather Shelter has been weather activated (a forecast of 40 degrees or below and/or 40% chance of rain)

Friends In Deed's **Homeless Prevention program** provides short-term and medium-term rental support, as well as move-in assistance, to individuals and families on the brink of becoming homeless. Nearly 70 individuals and families benefit from this program each year. This is a critical program because studies show that keeping a person housed is cheaper and more effective than trying to help someone get housed in the first place.

Friends In Deed's **Street Outreach Program** identifies chronically homeless individuals, on the streets of Pasadena, and works to build trust and relationships with them. The Outreach team's primary goal is to enter these folks into the Coordinated Entry System, which is the pathway to permanent supportive housing.

Center For Restorative Justice Works Get On The Bus

MISSION STATEMENT

Get On The Bus – *uniting children with their mothers and fathers in prison*-this statewide prison visiting program trains and educates hundreds of volunteers and supporters throughout California and engages the media to raise awareness about the plight of children with a parent in prison. Get On The Bus advocates for the right of children to see, embrace, and talk to their parent who is incarcerated.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT

Get On The Bus brings children and their guardians/caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. An annual event, that takes place in the Spring in honor of Mother's Day and Father's day; Get On The Bus offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, comfort care bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home all at no cost to the children's family). On the bus trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post-event counseling. Get On The Bus is a program of The Center for Restorative Justice Works, a non-profit organization that unites children, families, and communities separated by crime and the criminal justice system

In 2014, Vivien Sansour founded the *Palestine Heirloom Seed Library*. The *Library* and its *Traveling Kitchen Project* seek to preserve and promote threatened seed varieties, traditional Palestinian farming

practices, and the cultural identities associated with them.



Based in the village of Battir, a UNESCO World Heritage site outside Bethlehem, the Library also serves as home to *El Beir Arts & Seeds*, a space for collaborations with artists, poets, writers, journalists, and others to showcase and promote their talents and work.

Working closely with farmers, the Library has identified key seed varieties and food crops that are threatened with extinction and would provide opportunities to inspire local farmers and community

PEACE SISTERS

MISSION STATEMENT

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, Peace Sisters has been able to increase the number of students that we reach to over 450 girls in Dapaong, Togo (West Africa). All of the students who receive our assistance are underprivileged in some way - whether as orphans or by some other family struggle - and many of them would have discontinued their studies by now if it were not for the intervention of Peace Sisters.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT

<u>School Fees</u>: The primary role that Peace Sisters plays in Togo is to pay school fees for girls who cannot afford this expense. We also provide school supplies and solar study lamps to improve the quality of their education.

<u>ID Cards</u>: Many of our students were born at home and did not receive birth certificates. This later becomes an obstacle to obtaining the ID Cards that are required to access higher education opportunities at the university level. Therefore, we have begun the intensive process of assembling the documentation that girls will require to succeed.

<u>Covid Relief</u>: Due to the limitations of technology in Togo, when schools closed in March education came to a standstill. Distance learning is impossible in a place where many people do not even have electricity in their homes, so our girls lost out on months of education that they will never recover. In order to prevent this from happening again, we are producing a study guide that we will publish for our students so they will have additional resources to continue studying even if schools ever have to shut down again. This study guide will also enhance their ability to prepare for exams in future years even once Covid begins to wind down.
