Each week we put our faith into action: Demand Police Reform

This week we are asking people to join with the NAACP and sign a petition to our members of Congress demanding that they pass police reform. We've heard the story far too many times. This summer it was George Floyd, Breonna Taylor and Ahmaud Arbery. Before them, it was Tamir Rice, Eric Garner and Trayvon Martin. And now from Ohio it's Casey Goodson, who like so many before, happened to be in the wrong place, at the wrong time, in the wrong skin. Words cannot describe the profound sadness and anger that we feel not just for the names above, but the countless others we can't even begin to list here. One thing is clear from all this, the only way we can end the epidemic of police violence against Black people is by bringing systemic change to the institutions that are supposed to protect and keep us safe. The petition demands sweeping legislative solutions to the policing crisis. We want criminal justice policies that include treatment for addiction and mental health problems, judicial discretion in sentencing, and an end to racial disparities at all levels of the system. Despite being more likely to be unarmed (like Casey Goodson) Black people in the United States are THREE times more likely to be killed by police than their white counterparts. And despite violent crime being at relatively historic lows in recent years, use of violence by police has remained constant across the country. The problem isn't the people. It's the police that needs to change.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* and *Enfleshed*.

The biblical readings are from the new *The Women's Lectionary* year W, created by Rev. Dr. Wil Gafney.

In the fullness of time, align all things with your love, and bring us to that heavenly country where with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. Amen.

What is the Vestry?

The Vestry is the legal governing and decision-making body of All Saints Church, contains representatives elected from the congregation of All Saints Church, and meets virtually on a designated Tuesday each month at 6:00p.m. All Vestry meetings are open meetings. The presiding officer of the Vestry is the rector and there are two wardens, a senior warden and a junior warden. Vestry candidates are elected to one four-year term and must be off the Vestry for at least one year before being eligible for election to another four-year term. Youth candidates are elected to a shorter term determined by their school grade level.

What does Vestry do?

The Vestry sets the vision for All Saints Church. It also serves as the policy-making body for the church, as well as sharing in the spiritual leadership of the church. Last but not least, the Vestry has fiduciary responsibility for the church's finances. Additionally, every Vestry member serves on at least one Vestry Standing Committee or Vestry Ad Hoc Committee/Task Force. The Vestry Standing Committees are: Buildings & Grounds; Children, Youth, & Families; Congregational Development; Finance; Pastoral Care/Health & Healing; Peace & Justice/Office for Creative Connections; and Personnel.

What qualities should a Vestry member have?

Church canons and All Saints' policy require Vestry members to be pledging (committing to an annual financial gift) communicants of All Saints Church.

We seek people who are committed to and live out the Core Values of All Saints Church:

Radical Inclusion ▪ *Courageous Justice* ▪ *Joyful Spirituality* ▪ *Ethical Stewardship*

Additionally, we seek people who are:

Prayerful and committed to ongoing deepening of their spiritual journey ▪ Team players ▪ Active members of the Parish ▪ Articulate ▪ Strategic thinkers who also can roll-up their sleeves and get to work ▪ Willing to encourage others to participate in stewardship activities ▪ Socially aware ▪ Independent thinkers ▪ Someone with time to give to the Vestry as it is crucial to attend the Vestry and committee meetings.

A good vestry needs introverts and extraverts, faithful people from across spectra of race, economic class and generation, and people who think and approach leadership and the life of the church in a range of conventional and nontraditional ways. English fluency is not a requirement (translation services will be provided if needed)

What is the process for selecting Vestry members?

Here is the process for selecting Vestry members:

- A Vestry Nominating Committee is formed by the Rector and Wardens and approved by the Vestry. It is made up of a cross-section of Parish members, as well as the retiring members of the Vestry, the Rector, Parish Administrator, and Wardens.
- A request for nominations goes out to the Parish via the Sunday liturgy, email, the website, and social media. People are encouraged to self-nominate as well as to nominate fellow parishioners they feel would make good Vestry members.
- Nominations are accepted until **5:00p.m. Sunday, January 3, 2021**
- Once the Vestry Nominating Committee receives the nominations, they will review all nominations and make recommendations of the slate to be presented to the Vestry for a vote.
- The members of the slate will then be contacted and asked to serve. Once all have agreed, their photos and bios will appear on the All Saints website and in a parish-wide email so the Parish has the names and information about the nominees before they vote on the slate at the March 14, 2021, Annual Parish Meeting.

¿Qué Es la Junta Parroquial?

La Junta Parroquial es el órgano legal de gobierno y decisión de la Iglesia de Todos los Santos, formado por representantes elegidos de la congregación de la Iglesia de Todos los Santos, y que normalmente se reúne virtualmente un martes designado de cada mes a las 6:00 p.m. Todas las reuniones de la Junta Parroquial son reuniones abiertas. El presidente de la Junta es el rector y hay dos guardianes, un Guardián mayor y un Guardián menor. Los candidatos de la Junta Parroquial son elegidos por un período de cuatro años y deben estar fuera de la Junta por al menos un año antes de ser elegibles para otro período de cuatro años. Los candidatos jóvenes son elegidos para un período más corto, determinado por su nivel escolar.

¿Qué hace la Junta Parroquial?

La Junta Parroquial establece la visión de la Iglesia de Todos los Santos. También sirve como el órgano de formulación de políticas para la iglesia, y comparte el liderazgo espiritual de la iglesia. Por último, pero no menos importante, la Junta Parroquial tiene responsabilidad fiduciaria por las finanzas de la iglesia. Además, cada miembro de la Junta Parroquial sirve por lo menos en un Comité Permanente de la Junta Parroquial o Comité Ad Hoc/de Trabajo. Los comités permanentes de la parroquia son: Edificios y Propiedades; Niños, Jóvenes y Familias; Desarrollo Congregacional; Finanzas; Cuidado Pastoral, Sanación y Curación; Paz y Justicia/Oficina de Conexiones Creativas; y Personal.

¿Qué Cualidades Debería Tener un Miembro de la Junta Parroquial?

Los cánones de la Iglesia y la política de Todos los Santos requieren que los miembros de la Junta Parroquial sean comunicantes de la Iglesia de Todos los Santos que hayan hecho una promesa financiera (compromiso de un donativo financiero anual).
