LECTURA / LESSON

Lectura de Génesis (3:8–21).

De hoy en adelante caminarás arrastrándote y comerás tierra. Haré que tú y la mujer sean enemigas, lo mismo que tu descendencia y su descendencia. Su descendencia te aplastará la cabeza, y tú le morderás el talón. A la mujer le dijo: Aumentaré tus dolores cuando tengas hijos, y con dolor los darás a luz. Pero tu deseo te llevará a tu marido, y él tendrá autoridad sobre ti. And the man said, "The woman whom you gave to stand with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate." Then the SOVEREIGN God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." The SOVEREIGN God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you among all herd animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat, all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; her offspring will strike your head, and you will strike the heel of her offspring." To the woman God said, "I will greatly increase your painful toil and your pregnancies; in pain shall you birth children, and your desire shall be for your man, yet he shall rule with you." And to the man God said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your woman, and have eaten of the tree which I commanded you, 'You shall not eat from it,' cursed is the ground because of you; in painful toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life. Thorn and thistle shall it grow for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your brow shall you eat bread until you return to the ground; for out of it you were taken, you are dust, and to dust you shall return." LECTURA / LESSON

Lectura de Romanos (8:31–39).

A Reading from Romans (8:31–39).

¿Qué más podremos decir? ¡Que si Dios está a nuestro favor, nadie podrá estar contra nosotros! Si Dios no nos negó ni a su propio Hijo, sino que lo entregó a la muerte por todos nosotros, ¿cómo no habrá de darnos también, junto con su Hijo, todas las cosas? ¿Quién podrá acusar a los que Dios ha escogido? Dios es quien los hace justos. ¿Quién podrá condenarlos? Cristo Jesús es quien murió; todavía más, quien resucitó y está a la derecha de Dios, rogando por nosotros. ¿Quién nos podrá separar del amor de Cristo? ¿El sufrimiento, o las dificultades, o la persecución, o el hambre, o la falta de ropa, o el peligro, o la muerte violenta? Como dice la Escritura: «Por causa tuya estamos siempre expuestos a la muerte; nos tratan como a ovejas llevadas al matadero.» Pero en todo esto salimos más que vencedores por medio de aquel que nos amó. Estoy convencido de que nada podrá separarnos del amor de Dios: ni la muerte, ni la vida, ni los ángeles, ni los poderes y fuerzas espirituales, ni lo presente, ni lo futuro, ni lo más alto, ni lo más profundo, ni ninguna otra de las cosas creadas por Dios. ¡Nada podrá separarnos del amor que Dios nos ha mostrado en Cristo Jesús nuestro Señor!

What then shall we say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? God is the one who did not spare the very Child of God, but rather for all of us, handed the Messiah over. Will not God—with Christ—also give us everything else? Who then will bring any charge against the elect of God? God is the one who justifies. Who will condemn? It is Christ Jesus, the one who died, moreover the one who was raised and who is at the right hand of God, who intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will affliction, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, “For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.” No, in all these things we are completely victorious through the one who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor powers-that-be, nor things that are, nor things that will be, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Redeemer.

Now when you all see the desolating sacrilege set up where it ought not to be—let the reader understand—then those in Judea must flee to the mountains. Woe to those who have a child in womb and to those who are nursing infants in those days! Pray that it be not winter. For in those days there will be affliction, of such a kind as has not been from the beginning of the creation that God created until now, no, and never will be. And if the Living One had not cut short those days, no flesh would be saved; rather for the sake of the elect, whom God chose, God has cut short those days. And if anyone says to you all at that time, ‘Look! Here is the Messiah!’ or ‘Look! There is the Christ!’—do not believe it. False messiahs and false prophets will appear and produce signs and omens, to lead astray, if possible, the elect.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. 

The Racial Justice Ministry would like to invite you to a lively book discussion in honor of Black History Month. We will meet on Zoom. The cross and the lynching tree are the two most emotionally charged symbols in the history of the African American community. In this powerful work, theologian James H. Cone explores these symbols and their interconnection in the history and souls of black folk. Both the cross and the lynching tree represent the worst in human beings and at the same time a thirst for life that refuses to let the worst determine our final meaning. While the lynching tree symbolized white power and black death, the cross symbolizes divine power and black life. God overcoming the power of sin and death. For African Americans, the image of Jesus, hung on a tree to die, powerfully grounded their faith that God was with them, even in the suffering of the lynching era.



Guided Spiritual Position Exercise


