Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* and *Enfleshed*.

The biblical readings are from the new *The Women's Lectionary* year W, created by Rev. Dr. Wil Gafney.




A Reading from I Samuel (25:14–19, 23–25, 32–34, 42–43).

To Abigail, wife of Nabal, one of the boys reported: "Look! David sent messengers out of the wilderness to greet our lord; and he screamed at them. Yet the men were very good to us, and we were not put to shame, and we never missed anything all the days we were with them when we were in the field. They were a wall to us even by night and also every day; we were with them, keeping the sheep. Now know this and see what you can do; for evil against our master and against all his house has been resolved; he is worthless, no one can speak to him." Then Abigail hurried and she took two hundred loaves, two skins of wine, five prepared sheep, five measures of parched grain, one hundred clusters of raisins, and two hundred fig cakes and she loaded them on donkeys. And Abigail said to her boys, "Go on before me; I am coming after you." And her husband Nabal she did not tell. And Abigail saw David and she hurried and got down from the donkey, fell before David on her face, bowing to the ground. She fell at his feet and said, "Upon me my lord, the iniquity; please let your slave-woman speak in your ears and hear the words of your slave. Please my lord, do not set your thought on this worthless man Nabal, for as his name, thus is he; Nabal (meaning Disgrace) is his name, and he is a disgrace; now I, your slave, did not see my lord's boys whom you sent." Then David said to Abigail, "Blessed be the HOLY ONE, the God of Israel, who sent you to meet me today! Blessed be your discernment, and blessed be you, who have kept me today from coming for blood and saving myself by my own hand. Surely as the HOLY ONE the God of Israel lives, who has restrained me from hurting you, unless you had hurried and come to meet me, truly by the light of daybreak there would not have been left to Nabal anyone urinating against a wall." Later after Nabal's death, Abigail hurried and got up and mounted a donkey with five of her girls at her heels; she went after the messengers of David and she became his wife. David also married Ahinoam of Jezreel; both of them became his wives.

CONSECRATION *Kneeling or standing — all who are able.*

Priest: From your love and in your image you created us, breathing your spirit into the dust of the earth. When we failed to live in love, you loved us anyway, refusing to let us go. In Jesus of Nazareth you showed us what we might become. In miracle and mystery Jesus was born, as we are born, and lived as we might live.



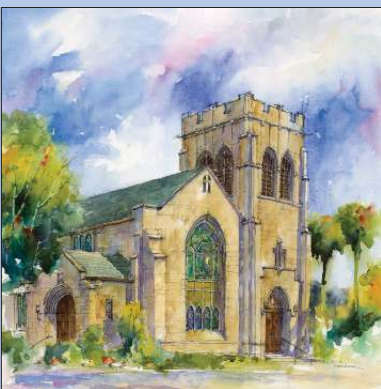
