

Incense will be used in today's services. If you'd like to sit in an "incense-free" zone, there is seating outside on the lawn.

It has been the custom in the Western Church to celebrate All Saints Day on November 1, remembering the lives of all Christians who have died. At our parish celebration of this festival, we remember by name all those close to the life of this parish who have died since last All Saints Day.

The traditional way of remembering the dead has been through the requiem, a mass for the dead. Today we offer selections from *Missa Pro Defuntis* by Tomás Luis de Victoria (c. 1549–1611) and *Lux Aeterna* by Morten Lauridsen (b. 1943). It is offered by Coventry Choir, with soloists Kyla McCarrel, soprano, Kimberly Poli, mezzosoprano, Daniel Ramon, tenor and Elliot Z. Levine, baritone, accompanied by piano played by Grace Chung. Weicheng Zhao conducts.

To maintain the solemnity of this occasion, there is no voluntary before the service. You are invited to use this added silent time for prayer and reflection. Please respect those around you by observing the period of silence preceding the service.

We ask that you extend a respectful courtesy to others by silencing all devices when entering the Sanctuary.

We honor the roots of our liturgical history by using the traditional language of Rite One from The Book of Common Prayer.

The smoke from the incense is a symbol of prayer and the mystery of life and death.





CONSECRATION *Kneeling or standing — all who are able.*

Priest: All glory be to thee, Almighty God, for that thou didst create heaven and earth, and didst make us in thine own image; and, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption. He made there a full and perfect offering for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks to thee, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for all, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O God, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful God, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy everlasting goodness to accept this our offering of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O God, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, Almighty God, world without end. *Amen.*


