As part of our commitment to seeking reconciliation with the land and all people who have lived on it, and according to our core values of Courageous Justice and Ethical Stewardship, All Saints Church is committed to acknowledging the land's history and working with the Tongva to perform reparative action.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* and *Enfleshed*. The biblical readings are from the new *The Women's Lectionary* year B, created by Rev. Dr. Wil Gafney.

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We ask that you extend a respectful courtesy to others by silencing all cell phones.

Minister: The Good News of Jesus as written in Mark (3:13–35).

People: Glory is yours, O Christ.

Now Jesus went up the mountain and called those he wanted to him and they came to him. And he appointed twelve whom he also named apostles in order to be with him, and to be sent out to preach and to have authority to cast out demons. So Jesus appointed the twelve: Peter (he gave Simon the name Peter), James son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (and he gave them the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the zealot, and Judas Iscariot who also betrayed him. Later, Jesus went into a house and the crowd of people came together again, so that they could not even eat a morsel of bread. And when his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for they were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the biblical scholars who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and it is by the ruler of the demons that he casts out demons." And calling them to him, he spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a realm is divided against itself, that realm cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against itself and is divided, it will not be to stand; rather, its end has come. On the contrary, no one can enter a strong person's house and plunder their property without first tying up the strong person and then the robber will plunder the house. Truly I tell you all that all things will be forgiven the woman-born, their sins and as many blasphemies as they blaspheme. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness rather, is guilty of an eternal sin." For they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." Then the mother of Jesus and his siblings came and standing outside, they sent for him and called him. Now a crowd of people were sitting around him and they said to him, "Look! Your mother and your siblings are outside, asking after you." And Jesus replied, "Who are my mother and my siblings?" And looking at those around him sitting in a circle, he said, "Here are my mother and my siblings! Whoever does the will of God is my sibling, and mother."

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

A period of silence is kept, during which the priest breaks the consecrated bread.

Priest: We are one bread, one body.

People: We will love one another as Christ loves us.

INVITATION

Priest: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

In accordance with our policy of common sense risk reduction — you will be offered the opportunity to receive bread as well as wine from the common cup if they so choose. As always, it is an individual choice — and those who come to the rail may choose to receive both bread and wine, bread only, or request a blessing.

Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey of faith, there is a place for you at Christ's table. When it comes time for communion, everyone of any age is welcome to receive either communion or a blessing.

If you wish to receive the bread, when you come to the front you may kneel or stand at the altar rail and hold your hands together in front of you to receive the bread.

If you wish to receive wine, help guide the cup to your lips or, if you prefer not to receive the wine, you may touch the base of the cup when it is presented to you.

If you wish to receive a blessing, when you come to the front, cross your arms over your chest, and you will be offered a blessing.

Gluten-free wafers and grape juice are available at your request.

By tradition, The Episcopal Church offers Holy Communion to all baptized persons. If you are not baptized, but wish to receive, we invite you to participate fully in the opening part of the service, called the Ministry of the Word, hearing God's word and reflecting on your life, enabling you to come to the table for communion, if you so choose, with a heart prepared to receive. We hope that if you feel touched by the word and sacrament and wish to learn more about the life-giving power of the Spirit of the Risen Christ, you will contact Alfredo Feregrino to inquire about participating in Holy Baptism.
