
A Lenten Journey Navigating the Deep Waters of Sorrow and Loss



St Augustine, The Confessions, Lenten Book Group






Father James Martin, Between Heaven and Mirth






The Amen Effect by Sharon Brous

to traditional Anglican repertoire and full-scale orchestral/choral works.


