As part of our commitment to seeking reconciliation with the land and all people who have lived on it, and according to our core values of Courageous Justice and Ethical Stewardship, All Saints Church is committed to acknowledging the land’s history and working with the Tongva to perform reparative action.

Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* and *Enfleshed*. The biblical readings are from the new *The Women's Lectionary* year B, created by Rev. Dr. Wil Gafney.

Priest: We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

In the fullness of time, align all things with your love, and bring us to that heavenly country where with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. Amen.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

A period of silence is kept, during which the priest breaks the consecrated bread.

Priest: We are one bread, one body.

People: We will love one another as Christ loves us.

INVITATION

Priest: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

In accordance with our policy of common sense risk reduction — you will be offered the opportunity to receive bread as well as wine from the common cup if they so choose. As always, it is an individual choice — and those who come to the rail may choose to receive both bread and wine, bread only, or request a blessing.

Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey of faith, there is a place for you at Christ's table. When it comes time for communion, everyone of any age is welcome to receive either communion or a blessing.

If you wish to receive the bread, when you come to the front you may kneel or stand at the altar rail and hold your hands together in front of you to receive the bread.

If you wish to receive wine, help guide the cup to your lips or, if you prefer not to receive the wine, you may touch the base of the cup when it is presented to you.

If you wish to receive a blessing, when you come to the front, cross your arms over your chest, and you will be offered a blessing.

Gluten-free wafers and grape juice are available at your request.

By tradition, The Episcopal Church offers Holy Communion to all baptized persons. If you are not baptized, but wish to receive, we invite you to participate fully in the opening part of the service, called the Ministry of the Word, hearing God's word and reflecting on your life, enabling you to come to the table for communion, if you so choose, with a heart prepared to receive. We hope that if you feel touched by the word and sacrament and wish to learn more about the life-giving power of the Spirit of the Risen Christ, you will contact Alfredo Feregrino to inquire about participating in Holy Baptism. 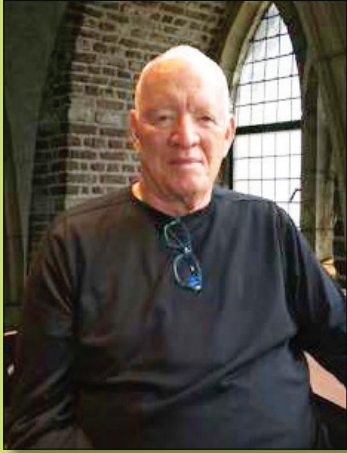

Adult Education with Rick Thyne: *Jesus At Ground Level*



Sundays, June 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30, 11:30 a.m.–12:30 p.m., in the Forum

For five Sundays in June, we'll explore together this person who is the center of our faith and, at the same time, the focus of so many of our questions and doubts. Does he still matter to us, or have we developed a faith that marginalizes him as we work to turn the human race into the human family? Bring your preconceptions and your open mind as we try to figure out the place Jesus holds in our beliefs and in our daily lives.

June 2: *Jesus At Ground Level: Who was he?* What do we know about his birth and his family? Was he educated? Was he very spiritual? How does he compare to Mohammed or the Buddha or Moses? Was he Divine?

June 9: *What did he say?* He is one of the most enduring teachers in human history; his stories and aphorisms, his parables and wise insights into people mark him as a teacher whose brilliance too often gets overshadowed by notions that he might have been Divine. What can we know about what he said, and which things that he taught still matter to us?

June 16: *What did he do?* We're told that he healed the sick, walked on water and, on a few occasions, raised up dead people from the grave. Really? Do we believe in these miracles? If so, why? If not, why not? If he matters to us, we want to figure out as near as we can what he did.

June 23: *Why did he die?* He was betrayed by his friends who turned him over to the religious and political leaders whom he threatened and, as they always do with revolutionaries, the authorities killed him. But is that it: is he just another martyr like so many other brave women and men? Or does his death have something to do with our sinfulness and God's forgiveness? Martyr or Savior: do you care which, if either, is true?

June 30: *Did God raise him from the dead?*

It's the most dramatic of the beliefs in the Christian faith: God raised a dead man, and Jesus is still alive in some heavenly realm, reigning over us and all of creation. It sounds ludicrous to a contemporary person who knows this kind of thing belongs in the category of fantasy and is not an event for educated people to take seriously. It may be nearly impossible to believe. But what if . . . ?
