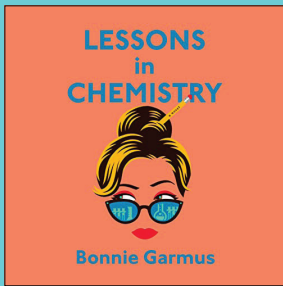
Recovery Eucharist Meets 1st and 3rd Wednesday at 6 p.m.

Dan Forrest, this work invites us into a deep

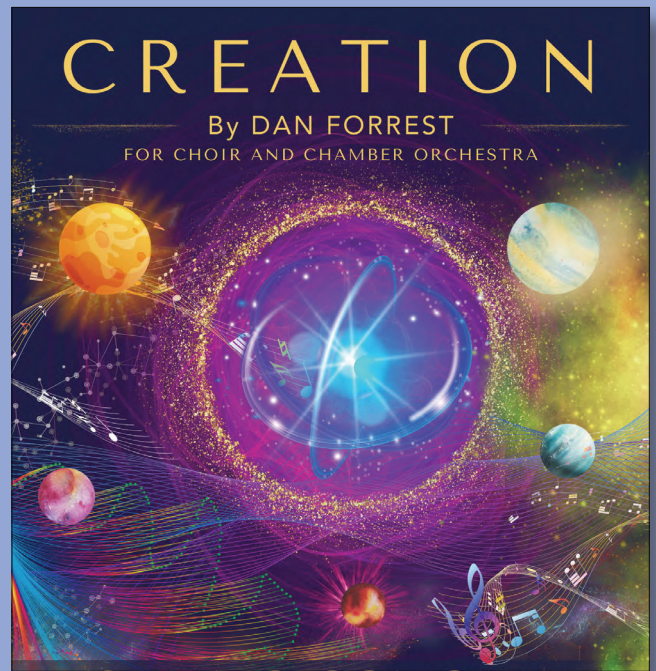

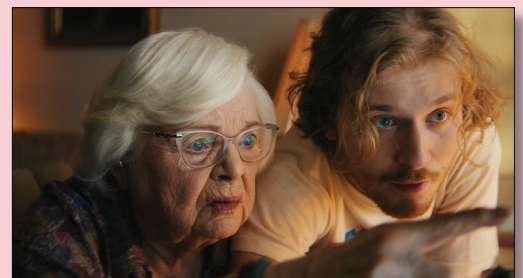
Join the Senior Saints monthly gathering for a Movie Day! We will be enjoying the movie *Thelma*,

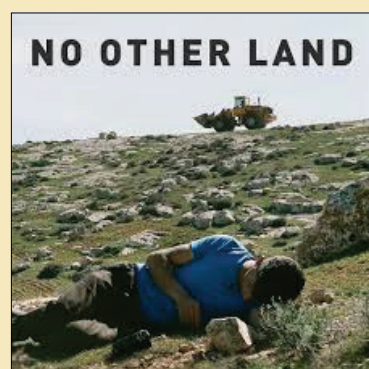


Film Screening of *No Other Land*

It stands as the foundation of our four core values of courageous justice, ethical stewardship, radical inclusivity, and joyful spirituality. Those core values are all a part of what we call the Beloved Community. It is a beautiful bond of relationships and connectivity that break through the glass ceilings of white supremacy, patriarchy, homophobia, transphobia, scarcity and so much more. It is not just a resisting of who we don't want to be and to become, but it is a visioning and striving towards the people and community we DO want to be and to become.
