Language In Worship: Because language has the power to shape our thinking about one another, All Saints Church makes every effort to bring the language of worship into conformity with the principles of biblical theology that affirm that the personhood of God embraces all expressions of gender lovingly and equally. Therefore, in our worship, we take our Bible readings from an inclusive language lectionary, which is often truer to original sources in references to people, and expands our concept of God beyond exclusively masculine terms. In Prayer Book liturgies we make minimal but symbolically important changes which denote our commitment to inclusive expression. Some historical texts that are widely known and loved are left unaltered. The words of the liturgy are from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*. The readings are from the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible, lectionary year C, as well as from *The Message* and from *Inclusive Hebrew Scriptures* and *New Testament* published by *Priests for Equality*.



PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The congregation sits.

(Names of those to be baptized are on page 30)

Priest: The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents, godparents, and sponsors now stand with the candidates.

The candidates who are able to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Sponsors.

The candidates unable to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Parents and Godparents.

Parents, Godparents, and Sponsors: I present *NAME* to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Priest: Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate: I do.

Then the priest asks the parents, godparents, sponsors of those to be baptized:

Priest: You have come here to present these individuals for baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit they are to receive the gift of new life from God, who is Love. Will you be responsible for seeing that each individual you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you by your prayers and witness help them to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you stand against all the forces that corrupt and destroy what God has created?

Answer: I will.

Priest: Do you seek to know God and live in God's love?

Answer: I do.

Priest: Do you put your whole trust in Christ's grace and love and promise to follow and obey Christ?

Answer: I do.

Standing — all who are able.

The priest then addresses the congregation.

Priest: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

Answer: We will.

Priest: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The priest blesses the water, first saying:

Priest: God dwells in you.

People: And also in you.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the people of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the messiah. In the water of baptism we are reborn by the Holy Spirit and share in Christ's resurrection. We now bring into the community those who come to Christ in faith.

Sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of the Holy Spirit, that those who are marked as Christ's own forever may embody God's love and justice throughout their lives.

People: Amen.

*The congregation sits.***THE BAPTISM***The family/sponsors of each candidate gather around the baptismal font.**The candidate is presented by name to the Priest, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying:*Priest: *NAME*, I baptize you in the name of the Creator, and of the Redeemer, and of the Sustainer.

People: Amen.

*The priest places a hand on the candidate's head, marking on the forehead,
with the oil of chrism, the sign of the Cross, and saying to each one:*

Priest: *NAME*, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

People: Amen.

*The minister then presents the candidate with a lighted candle.*Minister: *NAME*, receive the light of Christ, and shine forth as Christ's light in the world.

People: Amen.

When all have been baptized, the children around the font are sprinkled, in memory of their baptisms.

Priest: Remember your baptism.

Standing — all who are able.

Priest: Let us pray.

All-loving God, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have raised these individuals to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O God, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

People: Amen.

Priest: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Priest and People:

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim Christ's resurrection, and share with us in Christ's eternal priesthood.



Amen.

Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey of faith, there is a place for you at Christ's table. When it comes time for communion, everyone of any age is welcome to receive either communion or a blessing.

If you wish to receive the bread, when you come to the front you may kneel or stand at the altar rail and hold your hands together in front of you to receive the bread.

If you wish to receive wine, help guide the cup to your lips or, if you prefer not to receive the wine, you may touch the base of the cup when it is presented to you.

If you wish to receive a blessing, when you come to the front, cross your arms over your chest, and you will be offered a blessing.

Gluten-free wafers and grape juice are available at your request on the back side rails.

By tradition, The Episcopal Church offers Holy Communion to all baptized persons. If you are not baptized, but wish to receive, we invite you to participate fully in the opening part of the service, called the Ministry of the Word, hearing God's word and reflecting on your life, enabling you to come to the table for communion, if you so choose, with a heart prepared to receive. We hope that if you feel touched by the word and sacrament and wish to learn more about the life-giving power of the Spirit of the Risen Christ, you will contact Tim Rich (adult Baptism) or Amanda Baughman (infant/child Baptism) to inquire about participating in Holy Baptism. 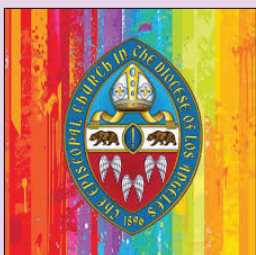

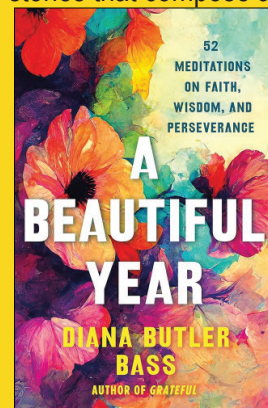

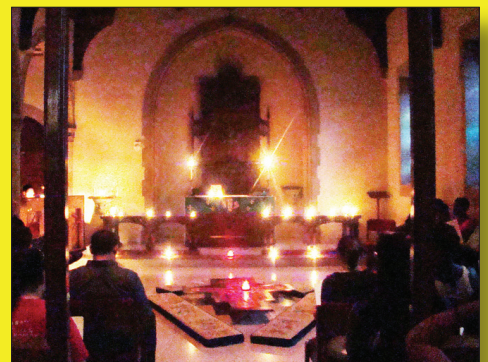
Meditation with the Labyrinth

Tuesday, December 9, 7:00–8:30 p.m., in the Regas House Lobby

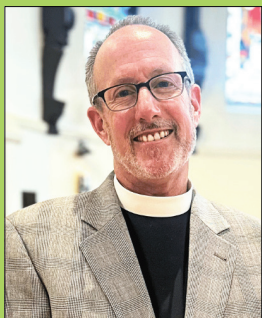
