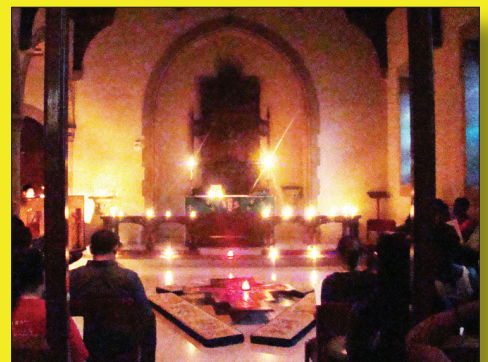
Meditation with the Labyrinth

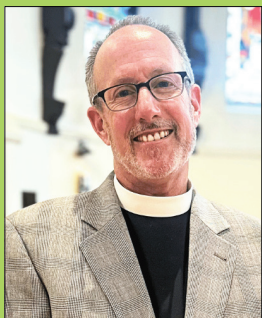
