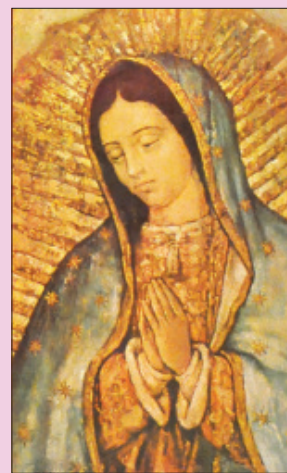

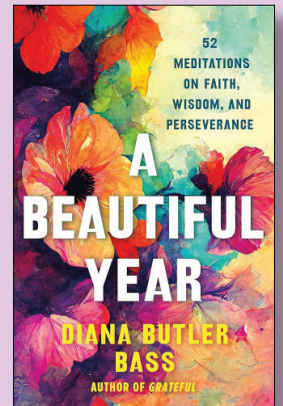

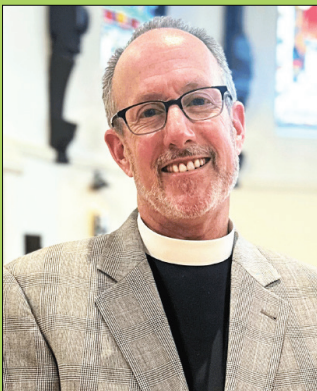

Marking One Year Since the Eaton Fire: A Week of Healing, Prayer, and Community

As we approach the one-year mark since the Eaton Fire, All Saints Church invites all who were impacted—those rebuilding, those still grieving, and the wider community who carries this collective memory—to join us for a week of healing, reflection, and support.

Healing Sunday – January 4

We begin this sacred week with Healing Sunday at All Saints. Thomas Diaz will preach as we gather to honor our resilience, acknowledge our losses, and hold space for the ongoing journeys of recovery. All are welcome.

Open Sanctuary – Monday through Sunday, January 5–11 (9:00 a.m.–4:00 p.m.)

Throughout the week, the church will remain open for quiet reflection, prayer, and remembrance. This is an unstructured space meant simply to be—to breathe, remember, and find comfort.

Wednesday, January 7 – Midday Eucharist & Evening Taizé

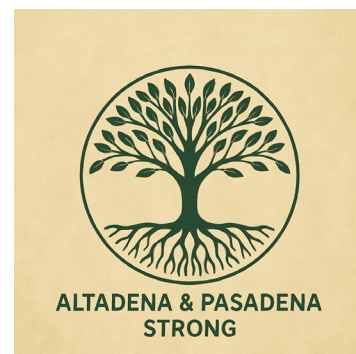


Sunday, January 11 – A Climate Evensong Offered by the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles
