



This parish-wide Lenten study invites the congregation to engage struggle honestly, recognize the gifts hidden within it, and reclaim hope as a resilient, communal, and transformative spiritual practice.

The Great Three Hours


12:00 – 3:00 p.m. in the Church

Sunday, April 19, 5:00 p.m. on the Chancel






