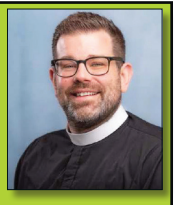

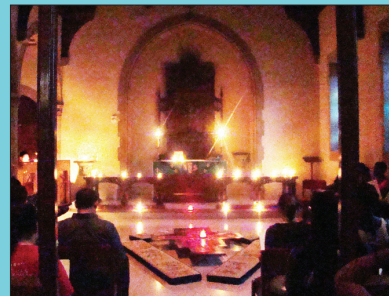

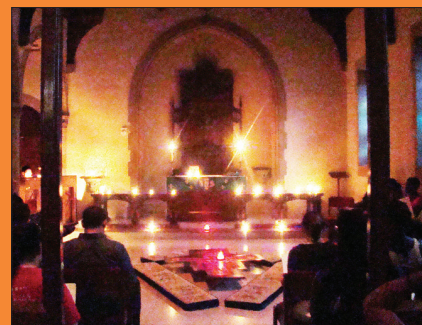
**Meditation with the Labyrinth &

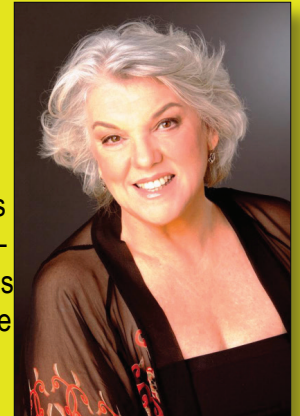


### **Brigadoon**

### **Exit the King**

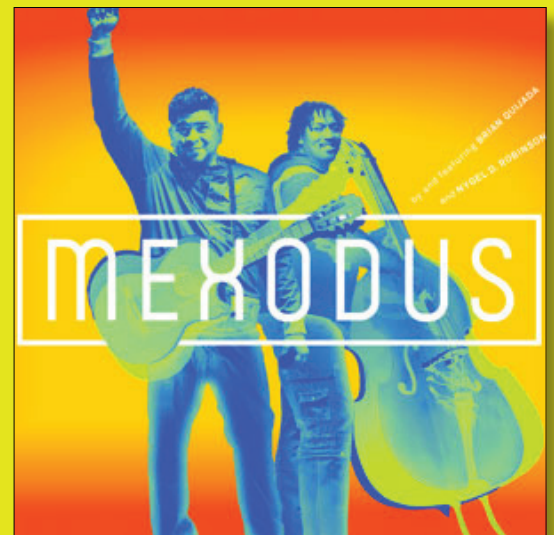
