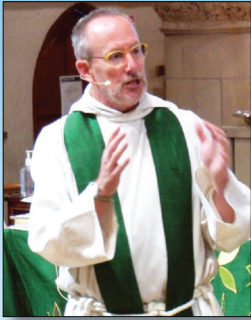

By understanding these factors, we can strive to do more

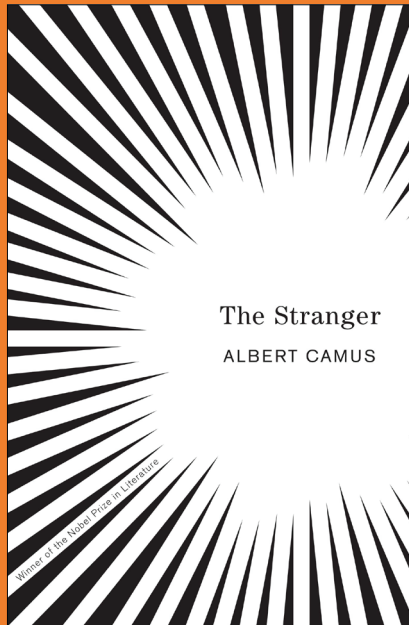
Recovery Eucharist Meets 1st and 3rd Wednesday at 6 p.m.

Fiction Fun! Reads *The Stranger* by Albert Camus

This is a classic work by a celebrated writer. As Adam Gopnik said in the *New Yorker*, we remember Camus “not just as a fine writer but as an exemplary man, a kind of secular saint, the spirit of his time, as well as the last French writer whom most Americans know something about.” *The Stranger* tells the story of Meursault, who kills an Arab man on a sunny Algerian beach. Why? Why not? (Any translation is acceptable. Many people will have read the one by Stuart Gilbert long ago, but he was English, and the Matthew Ward translation, dating from 1989, is much praised now. Ward was American, and the prose style of *The Stranger* owes much to hard-boiled American fiction.)

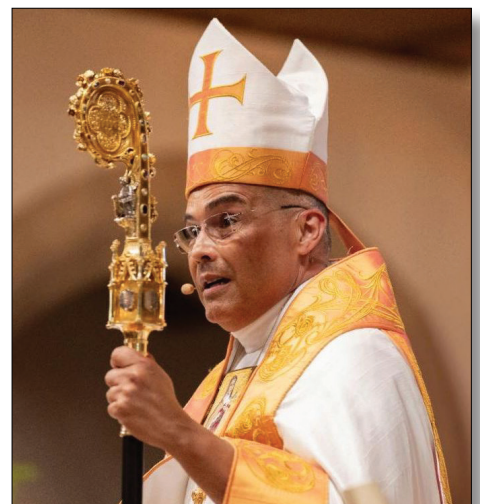

Write Postcards to Increase Voter Turnout

Democracy works best when everyone can participate in the process. For this midterm election, All Saints Church ensure voters in voter-suppression states know their voices – and their votes – matter by writing 1,000 postcards to voters of color in North Carolina and Georgia.

We have worked in our Sacred Being, Sacred Ground, and Beloved Community Circles sessions to build relationships and a greater understanding among ourselves about racial and ethnic justice, and the intersectionality of our multiple identities.

Now, together, we are ready to engage in collaborative work that gives deeper meaning to becoming a beloved community. We are partnering with the Center for Common Ground, anon-partisan, Black and women-led voting rights organization founded in 2018 that focuses on voter suppression in states where more than 20% of voters are voters of color (Alabama, Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Texas).

Another Step Toward Telling the Whole Story

James Baldwin famously noted that "Not everything that is faced can be changed, but nothing can be changed until it is faced." Join us at All Saints Episcopal Church in Pasadena on Sunday September 13th and on Monday September 14th, as we engage in an act of community remembrance to face All Saint's history of racial segregation. As part of that community remembrance, we will unveil a plaque to serve as a historical marker on our building's cornerstone that names and grieves this chapter in our parish's history. Our current building's cornerstone was laid in 1923, at a time when All Saints Church's White parishioners did not permit African Americans to attend worship services. This practice persisted for decades. It eventually led to the founding of St. Barnabas Episcopal Church in Pasadena as an act of resilience by the African Americans who were turned away. The plaque will tell this story so that our community might reflect and learn to grow towards what is God's true dream for us, a beloved community.

As part of our Homecoming service on September 13th we will gather outside on Euclid Avenue and Plaza Las Fuentes. We chose the date of homecoming to lament the reality that despite our name, all of the saints were not always welcome to come home. Together we will engage in a liturgy and worship whose cornerstone is truth telling.

On September 14th we will expand our community remembrance and truth telling to include our civic and community leadership, as we recognize that this story is part of the wider story of Pasadena.

Together, with God's help, let us face what cannot be changed, in order to change what we can still become.
