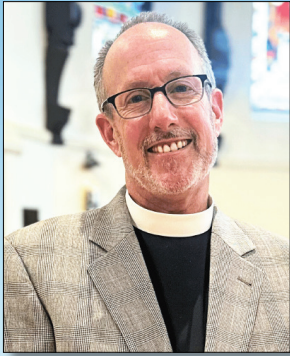

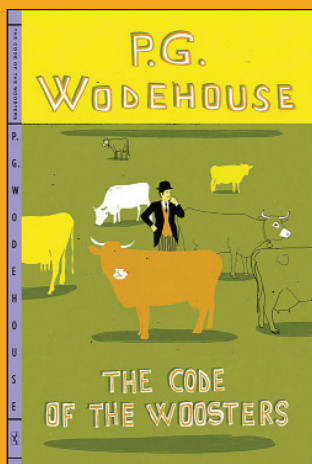

Interfaith Communities United for Justice and Peace (ICUJP) exists because of an extraordinary peace advocate — the late Rev. George F. Regas. In the days after 9/11, the former rector of All Saints Episcopal Church, Pasadena brought together Buddhist, Christian, Islamic, Jewish, Quaker, and other faith leaders and activists in Los Angeles to oppose the forces pressing for war and its devastating consequences. In his honor, every year we have recognized the work of other Peace advocates through the George F. Regas Courageous Peacemaker Awards. Previous recipients have included Rev. 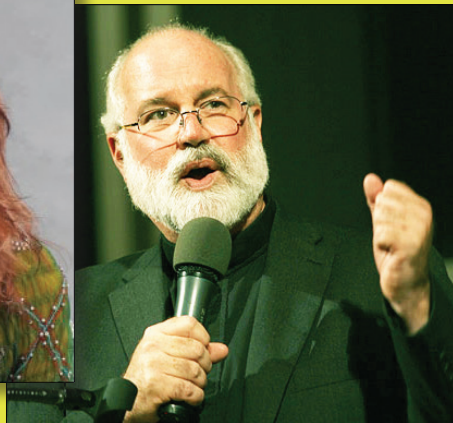
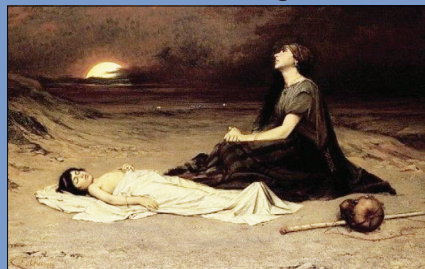

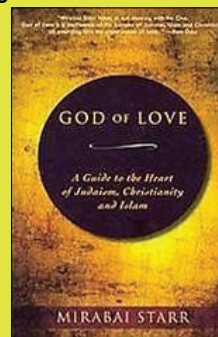

With 9 Grammy nominations to her credit, Tierney Sutton is widely regarded as one of the most distinctive and thoughtful voices in contemporary jazz. As vocalist, arranger, educator, and song writer, she has built a body of work marked by artistic integrity, collaborative innovation, and a profound commitment to storytelling. Raised in Milwaukee and currently based in Los Angeles and Paris, Sutton emerged in the 1990s with a fresh approach to jazz singing—one that blended impeccable musicianship, emotional depth, and a uniquely collaborative spirit. As leader of the acclaimed Tierney Sutton Band, she helped redefine the modern jazz vocal ensemble, creating recordings and performances that emphasized collective improvisation and sophisticated arrangements. Sutton's celebrated tributes to artists such as Bill Evans, Frank Sinatra, Joni Mitchell, and Sting helped establish her as one of the premier interpreters of the Great American Songbook and beyond. 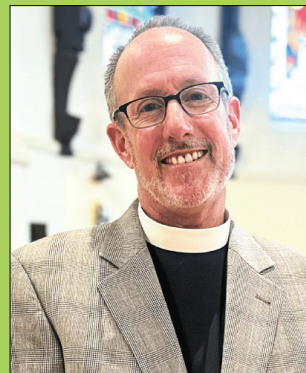

IT IS TIME TO NOMINATE NEW MEMBERS TO THE VESTRY!

What is the Vestry?

The Vestry is the legal governing and decision-making body of All Saints Church, contains representatives elected from the congregation of All Saints Church, and typically meets on a designated Sunday each month at 12:00p.m. All Vestry meetings are open meetings. The presiding officer of the Vestry is the rector/priest-in-charge and there are two wardens, a senior warden and a junior warden. Vestry candidates are elected to one four-year term and must be off the Vestry for at least one year before being eligible for election to another four-year term. Youth candidates are elected to a shorter term determined by their school grade level.

What does Vestry do?

The Vestry sets the vision for All Saints Church. It also serves as the policy-making body for the church, as well as sharing in the spiritual leadership of the church. Last but not least, the Vestry has fiduciary responsibility for the church's finances. Additionally, every Vestry member serves on at least one Vestry Standing Committee or Vestry Ad Hoc Committee/Task Force. The Vestry Standing Committees are: Audit; Buildings & Grounds; Children, Youth, & Families; Communications; Congregational Life; Finance; Giving; Pastoral Care and Peace & Justice.

What qualities should a Vestry member have?

Church canons and All Saints' policy require Vestry members to be pledging (committing to an annual financial gift) communicants of All Saints Church.

We seek people who are committed to and live out the Core Values of All Saints Church: *Radical Inclusion* ▪ *Courageous Justice* ▪ *Joyful Spirituality* ▪ *Ethical Stewardship*, as well as people who have a demonstrated commitment to eradicating racism and pursuing social progress both beyond and within All Saints Church.

Additionally, we seek people who are:

- Prayerful and committed to ongoing deepening of their spiritual journey ▪ Seeking collaboration and empowerment, not competition ▪ Active members of the Parish ▪ Self-reflective ▪ Strategic thinkers who also can roll-up their sleeves and get to work ▪ Willing to encourage others to participate in stewardship activities ▪ Compassionate and socially aware ▪ Independent thinkers ▪ Able to give time to the Vestry as it is crucial to attend the Vestry and committee meetings

A good Vestry needs introverts and extraverts, faithful people from across spectra of race, economic class and generation, and people who think and approach leadership and the life of the church in a range of conventional and nontraditional ways. English fluency is not a requirement (translation services will be provided if needed)

What is the process for selecting Vestry members?

Here is the process for selecting Vestry members:

- A Vestry Nominating Committee is formed. It is made up of the retiring members of the Vestry, the Rector/Priest-in-Charge, the Wardens, and several parish members representing a cross-section of the parish.
- A request for nominations goes out to the Parish via the Sunday liturgy, email, the website, and social media. People are encouraged to self-nominate as well as to nominate fellow parishioners they feel would make good Vestry members.
- Nominations are accepted until **5:00p.m. Sunday, October 4, 2026.**
- Once the Vestry Nominating Committee receives the nominations, they will review all nominations and make recommendations of the slate to be presented to the Vestry for a vote.
- The members of the slate will then be contacted and asked to serve. Once all have agreed, their photos and bios will appear on the All Saints website and in a parish-wide email so the parishioners have the names and information about the nominees before they vote on the slate at the Annual Parish Meeting.
