Wedding FAQ Sheet

Celebrating Love in the Episcopal Tradition

****We require a 6 month advice upon booking a wedding***

Welcome! We are honored that you are considering All Saints Church, Pasadena, for your wedding. Rooted in the Episcopal tradition, we are a progressive, inclusive, and welcoming congregation. We believe that all loving relationships are sacred, and we are here to support you as you begin your married life together.

Below are answers to frequently asked questions to help guide your planning process:

1. Do we need to be members of All Saints Church or Episcopalians to get married here?

Not at all. While one member of the couple must be a baptized Christian (as required by Episcopal Church canon law), you do not need to be an Episcopalian or a member of All Saints to be married here. We welcome people of all faith backgrounds who are seeking a sacred ceremony grounded in God's blessing.

2. Who officiates the weddings at All Saints Church?

Weddings are typically officiated by clergy from the All Saints Church staff. Clergy are assigned based on their availability for your chosen date. If you wish, clergy from other denominations or faith traditions may assist, with approval, alongside our Episcopal priest.

3. Is there a discount for church members?

Yes. If you or a close family member has been a pledging member of All Saints Church for three or more years, a membership fee reduction fee of 10% will be applied.

4. What days are available for weddings?

Weddings are generally scheduled on Fridays and Saturdays. Weekday ceremonies are possible, subject to availability and approval from the church office.

Please note:

Weddings are not scheduled on Sundays, during Holy Week, Memorial Day weekend, or in the month of December.

5. What liturgy is used for weddings?

We use the authorized rites of the Episcopal Church, most often The Celebration and Blessing of a Marriage 2 (as approved by the Diocese of Los Angeles). Readings are typically from the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) of the Bible.

6. Is premarital counseling required?

Yes. All couples are required to attend a preparatory counseling with the officiating clergy. These sessions are a chance to explore your relationship, your hopes for marriage, and the spiritual foundation of your commitment.

7. What kind of music is allowed during the ceremony?

Only sacred music is permitted during weddings at All Saints Church. While we understand the appeal of romantic ballads or popular love songs, those are best reserved for your reception. Exceptions may be made, with prior approval from the Music Department. *Music fees are separate and not included in our flat fee rate.

8. Can we have flowers?

Absolutely—if you choose. Floral arrangements are not required but may be added. The wedding coordinator will provide you with floral guidelines and delivery instructions if you plan to hire a florist.

9. Can we have photography or videography?

Yes, with some guidelines. Your photographer and/or videographer must follow church policies, which are provided in a required information/permission form. Couples may use the church space for photos for 30 minutes after the ceremony.

10. What is included in the wedding fee?

Our wedding package of \$5,000* includes:

- Premarital counseling with your clergy officiant
- Clergy officiant
- Sound engineer
- Wedding coordinator
- Use of the church
- Rehearsal time
- Dressing rooms
- Printed wedding service leaflet
- *Music fees are separate and not included in our flat fee rate.
