Each week we put our faith into action: The US Must Lead on the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

This week we are deeply concerned about the escalating, retaliatory violence occurring between Israeli and Palestinian forces. The escalation in Israel and Gaza over this past week is horrific. And now, tragically, with Hamas and other terrorist groups in Gaza firing rockets indiscriminately at Israeli cities and Israel responding with massive airstrikes, there are as of Thursday at least 83 Palestinians killed in Gaza and at least seven Israelis killed -- including, horrifically, children on both sides. Many more have been wounded. As a global superpower and Israel's closest ally, the United States is no mere bystander in this conflict. Our voice, our values and our leadership are vital. Right now, it's critical that the Biden administration engage proactively in securing an immediate ceasefire and pushing all sides to deescalate. With lives on the line, our government can and should be doing more. Therefore, this week we are asking you to sign a J Street petition calling on President Biden to push for de-escalation, to work toward brokering a ceasefire and to commit to sustained leadership to address the root causes at the heart of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict -- including the ongoing injustice of the occupation.




A Reading from I Peter (1:3–9).



Minister: The Good News of Jesus as written in John (11:28–44). People: Glory is yours, O Christ.

Now when Martha had said this, ("Yes, Rabbi, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who comes into the world"), she went back and called her sister Mary privately, "The Teacher is here and calling for you." And when Mary heard that she got up quickly and went to Jesus. Now Jesus had not yet come to the village, but was still in the place where Martha had met him. Thus the Jewish community who were with her in the house and consoling her saw Mary get up guickly and go out; they followed her thinking she was going to the tomb to weep there. So when Mary came where Jesus was seeing him, she knelt at his feet saying to him, "Rabbi, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Thus when Jesus saw her weeping and the Jewish folk who came with her also weeping, his spirit was disturbed and he was deeply moved. And he said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Rabbi, come and see." And Jesus wept. Therefore the Jewish people with her said, "See how he loved him!" Yet some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" Jesus, again deeply moved within himself, came to the tomb; it was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Rabbi, already there is a stench because it has been four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus lifted his eyes upward and said, "My God, I thank you for having heard me. I know that you always hear me, for the sake of the crowd standing here have I said this, so that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, with a loud voice he cried out, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, bound hand and foot with strips of cloth and, his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Loose him, and let him go."

How Can I Keep from Singing







CONSECRATION

Priest: Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Creator of all. Priest: Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect self-offering for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Priest and People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Priest: We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O God, in this offering of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's life, death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ.

Priest and People:

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kindom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ—by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. Amen.
