The Foster Care Project recruits and sustains volunteers who serve in public and private agencies or work on special projects designed to enhance the lives of foster, homeless, transitional and incarcerated children and youth.

In partnership with government and local communities, GAIA strengthens the healthcare grid in underserved regions of Africa through community-based health services and a health workforce development program.


Community-Based Health Services

MOBILE HEALTH CLINICS

GAIA operates 7 mobile clinics that nimbly and effectively fill gaps in the existing healthcare grid, making quality health care available to 1.5 million rural Malawians across 3 southern districts.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH & EDUCATION

GAIA prevents new HIV infections and reduces vulnerability among orphans and adolescent girls and young women through educational support and wrap around social services, improving the wellbeing of 30,000 children and their families across 3 southern districts.



HEALTH WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM

In partnership with local universities, GAIA provides comprehensive support to underserved nurse scholars, enabling them to complete their education and certification while putting a significant dent in Malawi's chronic shortage of health professionals.

BUILDING WORKFORCE CAPACITY

GAIA supports the deployment of health workers where they are needed most. At the community level, GAIA provides on-the-job training and certification for clinic and community-based health workers.

Organizational History

In 2000, Episcopal priest Bill Rankin and renowned neurosurgeon Dr. Charlie Wilson founded GAIA to increase health equity globally and to bring life-saving HIV treatment to the countries most impacted by the AIDS epidemic. Throughout our history, GAIA has expanded our services to provide compassionate, client-centered health care to meet immediate needs while strengthening Malawi's healthcare workforce for the long-term.

The Middle East Ministry (MEM) advocates for justice, peace and reconciliation between Israel and Palestine. MEM also seeks to educate the parish and community by sponsoring speakers, films and other up-to-date presentations on the situation in Palestine and Israel.

In 2014, Vivien Sansour founded the *Palestine Heirloom Seed Library*. The *Library* and its *Traveling Kitchen Project* seek to preserve and promote threatened seed varieties, traditional Palestinian farming



practices, and the cultural identities associated with them.

Based in the village of Battir, a UNESCO World Heritage site outside Bethlehem, the Library also serves as home to *El Beir Arts & Seeds*, a space for collaborations with artists, poets, writers, journalists, and others to showcase and promote their talents and work.

Working closely with farmers, the Library has identified key seed varieties and food crops that are threatened with extinction and would provide opportunities to inspire local farmers and community

members to actively preserve their bioculture and recuperate their local landscape. Your gift will further efforts to identify, preserve and propagate heirloom seed varieties in Palestine. Contact <u>allsaintsmem@yahoo.com</u> for holiday card choices and payment options.

PEACE SISTERS (Founded by Tina Kampor)



MISSION STATEMENT

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, Peace Sisters has been able to increase the number of students we reach to over 470 girls in Dapaong, Togo (West Africa). All of the students who receive our assistance are underprivileged in some way - whether as orphans or by some other family struggle - and many of them would have discontinued their studies by now if it were not for the intervention of Peace Sisters.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT

<u>School Fees</u>: The primary role that Peace Sisters plays in Togo is to pay school fees for girls who cannot afford this expense. We also provide school supplies and solar study lamps to improve the quality of their education, and we have begun providing menstrual pads and basic health insurance to prevent absenteeism. A year of school for each girl is estimated to cost \$40.

ID Cards: Many of the students in our program were born at home and did not receive birth certificates. This later becomes an obstacle to obtaining the ID Cards that are required to access higher education opportunities at the university level. We have therefore begun the intensive process of assembling the documentation that girls will require to succeed.

<u>Higher Education</u>: In 2021, Peace Sisters was thrilled to celebrate the first College Graduation for a student in our program! We anticipate that around 30 girls will pursue a higher education this year, and we are currently expanding our fundraising to ensure we can help them attain their dreams. A year of school for each girl at the university level is estimated to cost \$1,000.

Through prevention, education, family support, and access to healthcare services, Young & Healthy protects and improves the physical and mental health of uninsured and underserved children and their families in the greater Pasadena area.

VISION

We envision a future in which all children in our community have a "village" that cares about them and an equal opportunity for a healthy life.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In order to maintain a pediatric health safety net for children in our community, Young & Healthy:

- Provides access to free medical, dental and psychological services for low-income, uninsured children via professional volunteer providers
- Assists with insurance navigation and enrollment services
- Provides Trauma Informed Care training to parents, caregivers and professionals
- Offers trauma sensitive mindfulness training to PUSD students
- Provides First Grade Dental Education training for in all PUSD first grade classrooms
- Brings the USC Mobile Dental Clinic to the Pasadena area annually to address the acute dental needs of children
- Has pivoted, in the face of COVID, to collect and provide essential supplies to families in need
- Offers free tax preparation program where we assist the community in filing their taxes and provides education on the many benefits of filing
