The rector Mike Kinman called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm in Sweetland Hall and using Zoom Webinar. He welcomed Bishop Taylor and asked the vestry to introduce themselves and say where their grandparents came from. Kinman ended with a prayer.

Hines welcomed the visitors.

Worthy Deamer had the Vestry read the mission statement of All Saints Church aloud together.

#### ITEMS FOR DECISION

#### Approval of the Consent Agenda

Report of the Clerk: It was moved by Little, seconded by Jones, and the vestry unanimously approved the minutes of the January 26, 2023 meeting and committee reports as submitted.

## Report of the Treasurer

Meier reported that the finance committee reviewed a document, put together by Howard, establishing a Financial Accountability Structure, which outlines governing and regulatory items that we need to follow. The document addresses responsibilities, communication and oversight for staff, vestry, and officers. It establishes an internal oversight team that will meet quarterly, which includes the rector, convener of the administrative circle, controller, director of giving, associate of giving, and director of IT. The chair of the finance committee is to present the finance reports to the Vestry. The finance committee reviewed and accepted the report.

Kinman thanked Karen Meier, Tim Stratz and Sally Howard for this amazing work that will set us up for the future.

## **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

Stratz reported that the committee has updated policies and procedures on expenditures and a gift acceptance policy. They are looking at the financial statements and will hopefully bring them to the vestry by the next meeting. A committee is starting to look at a policy around contracting for people of color.

#### **DIOCESAN CONVENTION DELEGATES**

Hines presented the slate of nominees for the Diocesan Convention to include Risë Worthy Deamer, Blaine Cavena, Thomas Diaz, Tim Stratz, Crystal Jones and Julianne Hines. It was moved, seconded, and the Vestry unanimously approved the slate to be approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting.

#### **UPDATE: TELLING THE WHOLE STORY: STAINED GLASS**

Steve Williams chairs the committee. He described their process. He referred to the books by Jack LeVan and Bill Doulos as great resources. He described the deep research that the committee has done. The committee will not make a decision on the stained glass but will collect information and present what they found, and it will be up to the vestry to make any decisions. Discussion followed.

#### **UPDATE: TELLING THE WHOLE STORY: LAND**

Earnshaw shared the task of the Land committee. They described the research that has been done as well as the archival work done prior to All Saints existed. The Forum on March 25 will cover the research and the historical and archival work done. They asked the vestry to attend. Kinman described the process of reconciliation.

#### **UPDATE: PACES**

Eddie King reported that there are three major areas at this point including HVAC and roof repair, the rectory upgrade, and replacing Scott Hall.

#### **UPDATE: STRATEGIC DIRECTION**

Tony Jackson shared that their work is almost complete. The final report will be ready for delivery in March. There are four main sections including the process, aspirational vision, three main goals, and recommendations. He suggested that the Vestry/Staff Conference would be a good place to work deeply on this. He also recommended a committee structure to make the vestry continuously effective.

# RT. REV. JOHN H. TAYLOR, BISHOP OF DIOCESE OF LOS ANGELES

Bishop Taylor shared his appreciation to those All Saints leaders who make a difference in the wider church. He described the disparity and self-sacrifice. He described five observations. Without the broad Episcopal Anglican view, the nation would be doomed to slip into the heresy of white male supremacy. The diocese thrives on the re-distribution of wealth and privilege. Our diocese is the best way to respond to homelessness by the use our property. Our diocese cannot survive from sale of property and liquidating capital funds. Finally, listening to people and learning how people are living their lives will lead to empathy and lead to relationship and reconciliation. He then opened it to questions and comments.

# ANNOUNCEMENT OF SENIOR WARDEN

Kinman thanked Julianne Hines for her amazing leadership. He announced that the new Senior Warden is Risë Worthy Deamer. Worthy Deamer asked for prayers and expressed gratitude for the vote of confidence from Kinman and the support and leadership of Hines.

## **UPDATE: VESTRY/STAFF CONFERENCE**

Worthy Deamer reminded the vestry that the Vestry/Staff Conference will be on March 17 and 18. Friday is dinner at the rectory and Saturday will be at the church. We will take a deeper dive into the strategic direction report. Please plan to attend.

## **WARDENS REPORT**

Hines reminded the vestry that the PACES tours will begin on February 26. Sign up for one of the tours. She will send the link for signing up.

We need volunteers for both Family Hour and Children's Chapel. Please sign up. It shows the importance of our children's ministry. Kinman said it is very fun, and reminded vestry that they can think about inviting others to do this.

# **RECTOR'S REPORT**

Kinman reported on his experience in Chicago. There are large churches around the United States that are progressive and that we can learn from. We started with Trinity United Church of Christ and the Reverend Otis Moss. Team members who went shared their experience with the vestry. They spoke of intentionality, the Beloved Community being present, warmth and welcome, building a safe space where people can be who they are, how they communicate what they are doing in God's presence. Kinman suggested we can look at All Saints as an Afro Futuristic church.

#### **LOOSE ENDS**

- Diaz reminded vestry to get the message out about all of our Lenten offerings.
- Feregrino offered the Getting Connected class to the vestry to get deeper into the Episcopal Church and the Book of Common Prayer. It is an opportunity to get deeper into our church.
- Howard shared that the choir will be mask optional going forward. She thanked Nicole Gatto for her leadership during COVID.
- Hayes announced that the Homeless Memorial is planned for Monday, March 6 at 6pm.
- Gould commended Sunday's Forum. It was a fantastic discussion.
- Cole announced that Brandi Miller will be with us from Christ Church in Seattle. She is a gifted preacher and will be here for a whole weekend in March.

# SCOTT HALL UPDATE

- Phil Naecker gave an update on Scott Hall improvements that will make it safe for childcare to take place there again. Phil, Toni Boucher, Chris Runco, Verna Zamora, Nina Scherer and Lonnie Schield have been working together on a plan. Please see link here. - Some improvements are safety-related, such as: figuring out how to heat the space; if there is mold or mildew and, if so, eradicating it; cleaning/replacing the sand in the back; fixing unsafe sidewalks; bringing emergency exit ramp up to code.
- We are asking for \$10,000 (likely will not use it all) from Finance. Phil suggested that CYF bring the request for funds, Christine has asked if it should rather come from B&G. Either way, we'll be asking for these funds soon.

Forgot to announce at the meeting but All Saints provided 355 gift cards totaling over \$12,000. AMAZING! Some folks expressed they missed giving actual gifts, the feedback from DCFS is that the gift cards made things much more streamlined. We'll work with them next year to see what makes sense.

#### Childcare

See Scott Hall update above. We still need to get childcare in place even with Scott Hall in progress. Nina is working on different options, including the family room on the first floor of Regas House and the Junior High room on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. There are budget meetings happening and we need to make sure that we have ample budget to accommodate childcare for our growing number of families.

#### New Families

We talked about being more intentional about welcoming families with children during the 10 am service. For example, during the welcome before the service begins make sure that folks know about the rug on the side, as well as affirming that we love having children in church (it's a "joyful noise" or something like that) and we want parents to feel comfortable staying. It would be great to put this in every week as boiler plate language. What do we need to do to make that happen?

#### OWL

Neighborhood UCC is offering OWL classes and a few All Saints families have signed up. Unfortunately, the classes take place during our 10 a.m. service time, but there is definitely a need here. Assuming that we can get the volunteers in place, we are working to ramp up OWL again.
