The meeting was called to order at 6:02 pm by Rector Mike Kinman in Sweetland Hall and using Zoom Webinar. He opened with a meditation, shared two stories of crisis and healing, and shared the importance of focus on the individual as well as the community. He ended with a prayer.

Hines welcomed the visitors.

Worthy Deamer had the vestry read the mission statement of All Saints Church aloud together.

ENDORSEMENT CANDIDATES FOR HOLY ORDER

Russell explained the process to ordination. She introduced Mel Soriano and Jonathan Stoner and each described their work since their last meeting with the Vestry. They are now ready to become candidates for holy order.

It was moved and seconded and with one abstention, the Vestry endorsed Mel Soriano for Holy Orders.

BUSINESS ITEMS

Approval of the Consent Agenda

Report of the Clerk: There was one edit to the RJAB report in the minutes: replace "there is a baseline assessment" with "there should be a baseline assessment". It was moved by Jones, seconded by Milburn, and the Vestry unanimously approved the minutes from the November 10, 2022 meeting with the noted edit and the committee reports as submitted.

Report of the Treasurer

Meier shared that there are no new financials. The controller, Erin Sacco Pineda, has been redirected to work with the Giving Department so that the end-of-year giving statements can be sent out in a timely manner. August is completed. She is working on credit card charges. A Budget Committee will be called in late January. We are reviewing our process. The Vestry expressed their thanks to Erin and to Sally Howard, Karen Meier and Rick Felton.

Clergy Housing Allowance

Resolution I.

Whereas, the Internal Revenue Code permits ministers to exclude from gross income "the rental value of a home furnished as part of compensation" or a church-designated allowance paid as a part of compensation to the extent that actual expenses are paid from the allowance to maintain a parsonage owned or rented by the church;

Whereas, the church compensates Mike Kinman for services in the exercise of ministry; and Whereas, the church provides Mike Kinman with rent-free use of a parsonage owned by the church as a portion of the compensation for services rendered to the church in the exercise of ministry;

Resolved, That of the annual compensation, \$10,000 per year (\$416.67 per pay period), is a designated housing allowance; and

Resolved, That this designated amount as a housing allowance shall apply until otherwise provided.

It was moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously approved the resolution.

Resolution II.

Whereas, the Internal Revenue Code permits a minister to exclude from gross income a church-designated allowance paid as part of compensation to the extent used for actual expenses in owning or renting a home; and

Whereas, the church compensates Sally Howard, Jose Alfredo Feregrino, Susan Russell and Mark Chase for services in the exercise of ministry;

Resolved, That of the annual compensation, the following amounts are a designated housing allowance:

- 1) Sally Howard -- \$80,500 per year (\$3,354.17 per pay period)
- 2) Jose Alfredo Feregrino -- \$70,000 per year (\$2,916.67 per pay period)
- 3) Susan Russell -- \$20,800 per year (\$866.67 per pay period)
- 4) Mark Chase -- \$47,540 per year (\$1,980.83 per pay period); and

Resolved, That the designated amounts as a housing allowance shall apply until otherwise provided.

It was moved, seconded and the vestry unanimously approved the resolution.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Stratz reported that they received the August financials and hope to have more to report at the next meeting. The Gift Policy is being reviewed and updated by Terry Knowles, Gloria Pitzer, Kimberli Hudson, Sally Howard, and Rick Felton. They also hope to have more by the next meeting.

GIVING REPORT/PLEDGING

Felton reported that we have challenges and they are contacting those who pledged last year and have not yet pledged this year. Last year at this time, we had 539 pledges for \$2,580, 319. This year we currently have 369 pledges for \$1,916, 565. There will be some personal contacts with major pledgers. We started late this year, but Felton feels confident that we will make a significant dent in this deficit.

VESTRY SLATE UPDATE

Hines reported that people have been invited and are discerning now. We will have a slate by the end of the week. Vestry will vote electronically for the full slate when it is available.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION COMMITTEE UPDATE

Tony Jackson shared an update on the work of the Strategic Direction Committee. Kinman thanked Jackson. Jackson shared the process and where we are now. It included a survey and listening sessions, which gave us rich thoughts and data. There are three big goals and directions. Hope to have the report ready to present to the Vestry by the March meeting. Kinman shared the three goals:

- 1. Who and How God is calling us to be a congregation
- 2. What and How God is calling us to do and be in the world.
- 3. How we can refresh our physical space to facilitate and amplify this direction

Kinman shared that we are called to dismantle White Supremacy and become a beloved community. Everyone has a role to play and everyone needs to be seen and heard. We need to continue the work to build relationships. We need to shape our diversity to move beyond inclusion to radical belonging.

We need to evolve our communications platform. We need to build capacity to organize and collaborate. We need to balance reflection and action. The theological formation unifies without uniformity. We need to partner with progressive faith communities and organizations. We need to focus our education and activism.

One PACES goal has been chosen to achieve. We have to address critical deferred maintenance.

The vestry was then able to ask questions.

VESTRY MANUAL UPDATE

Howard appreciated the feedback given so far. She confirmed it is a manual, not a handbook, and it is not a legally binding document. The committee that produced the manual is Trula Worthy-Clayton, Maren Tompkins, Samantha Kramer and Sally Howard, with input from Sharon Browning and Neil Barker.

WARDENS REPORT

Hines shared that Vestry members need to review the Safe Church training video and material. Tip is to read the material. The Bishop is coming to the February 7 meeting and would like all to complete the training. She encouraged everyone to attend that meeting in person if possible. Risë will send an email.

RECTOR'S REPORT

Eddie King reported that we have serious leaks in the north transept from the recent rain. We need to address this issue. King suggests that we need an endowment for the maintenance.

Kinman shared that Dr. Wil Gafney will be here for part of Lent and Holy Week. Bishop Gene Robinson will be here the week following Easter for confirmation.

This is Art McDermott's last vestry meeting. The Vestry Nominating Committee is putting forward Jonathan Quinn to finish Art's term. It was moved by McDermott, seconded by Eddie King and the Vestry unanimously approved Jonathan Quinn to fill the unexpired term of Art McDermott. Kinman then recognized McDermott for his work and said goodbye.
