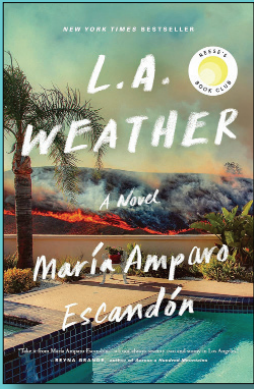


If You Crochet or Knit, Consider Joining the Prayer Shawl Ministry

Getting Connected: An Introduction to All Saints Church

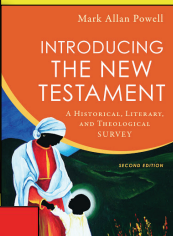
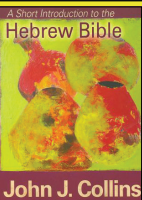


Classes start Sunday, September 29, 12:00 – 1:30 p.m.,
